During the quarter 726 notifications were received, consistent with previous quarters.

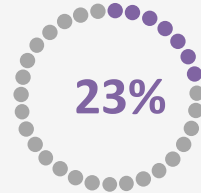
Members of the public again accounted for the largest proportions of notifications received.

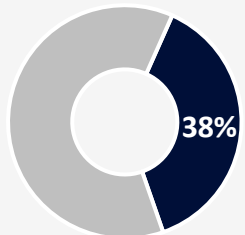

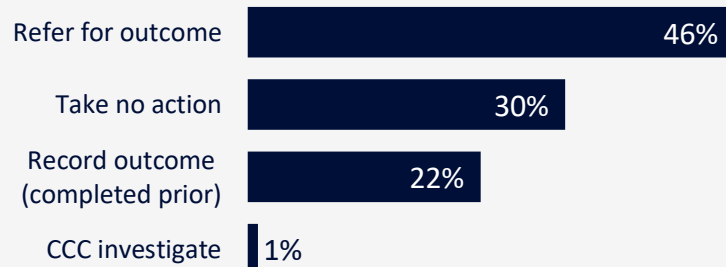


Action Taken

Of the 577 allegations that were assessed as suspected serious misconduct, 46% were referred back to the appropriate authority for action.



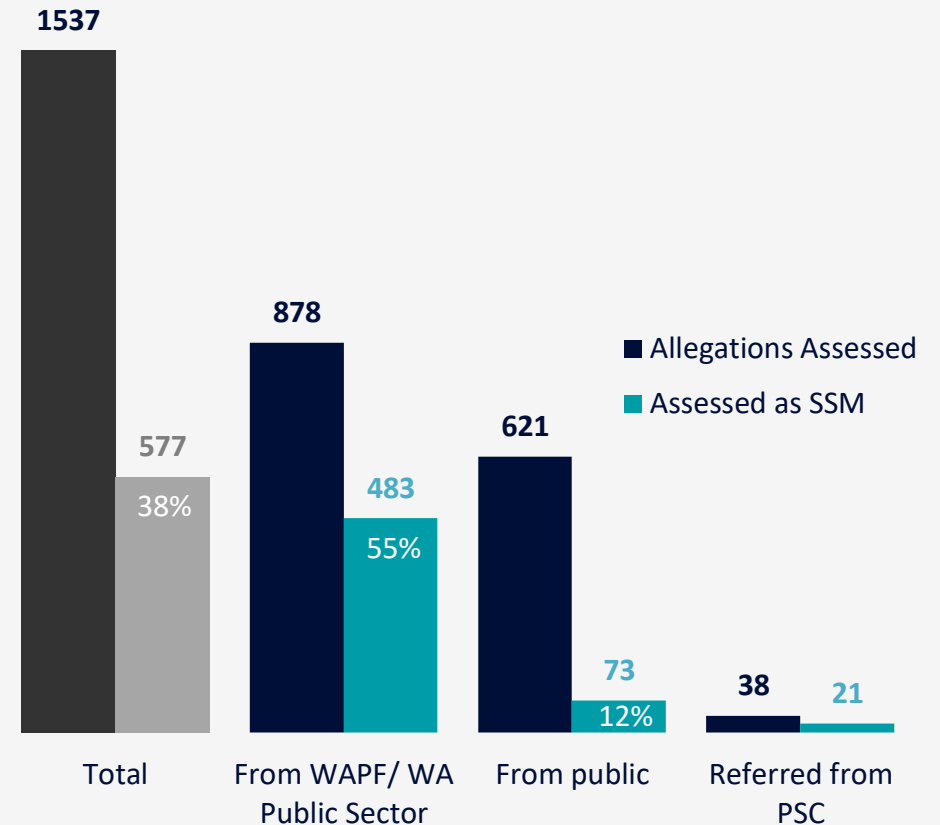

Allegations Assessed

1537 total allegations were assessed during the quarter.

Overall 38% of allegations assessed met the threshold of suspected serious misconduct.

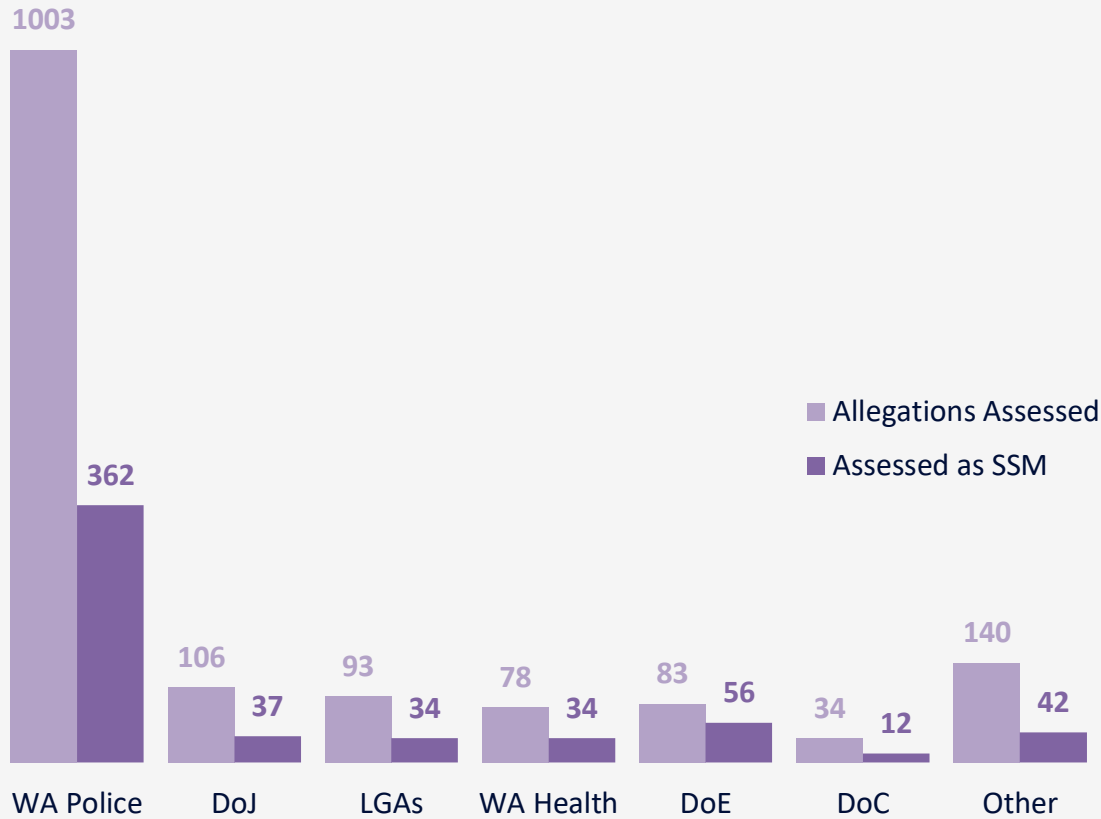


Allegations Assessed



Allegations Assessed

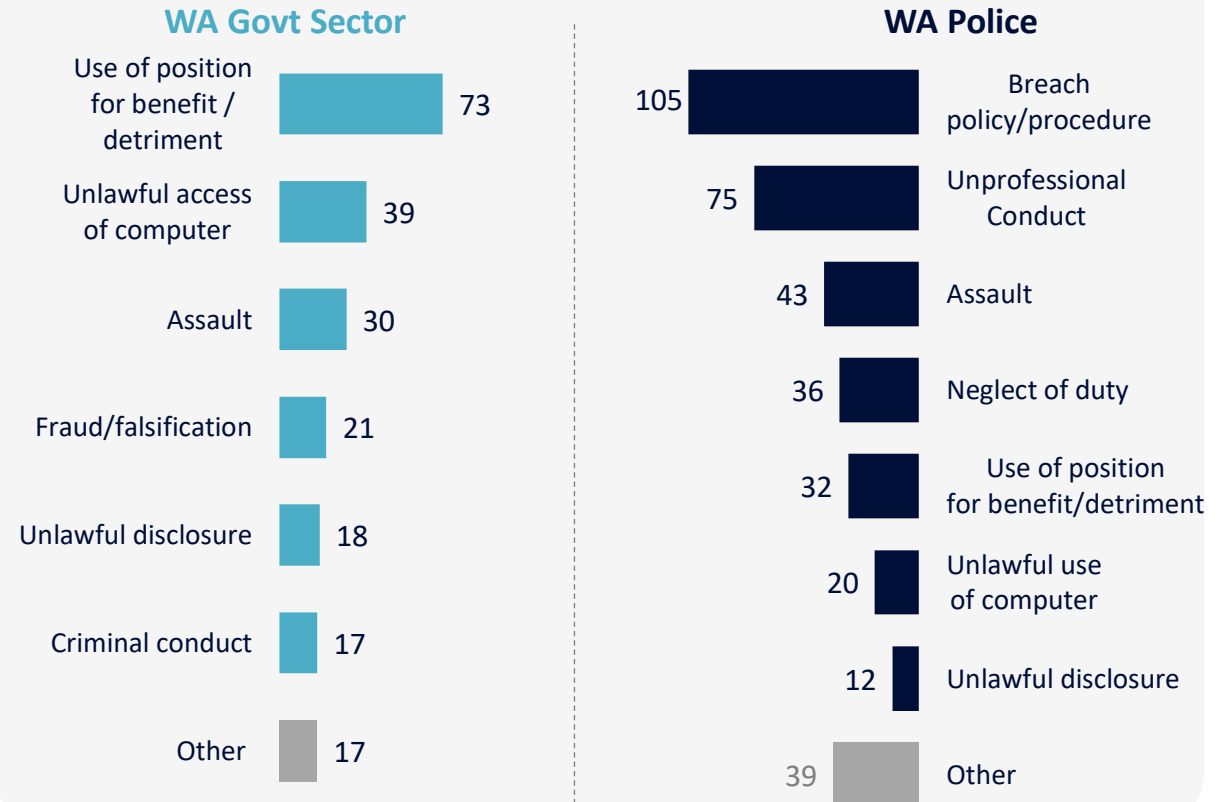
The majority of allegations assessed were related to WA Police which is consistent with previous quarters. This is indicative of both the public-facing nature of police work as well as the Commission's jurisdiction extending to include minor misconduct in relation to WA Police.



Allegation Categories - SSM

In the WA Government sector, the most common categories of allegations that met the threshold of serious misconduct were corrupt use of position for a benefit or detriment, unlawful use of a computer and assault.

For police, breach of procedure and unprofessional conduct were the most common areas of suspected misconduct.

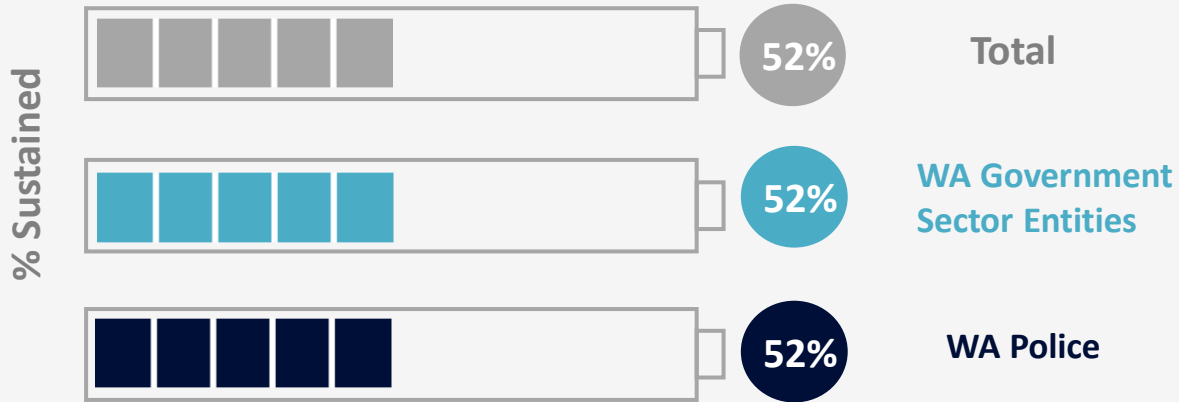


Allegation Outcomes



Outcomes Recorded

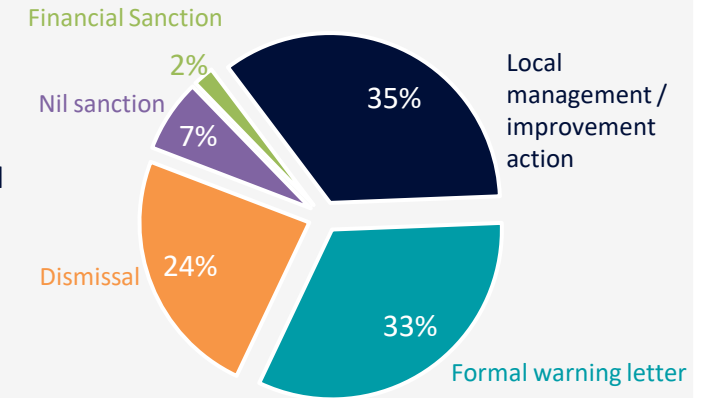
During the quarter, the outcomes of 335 allegations were recorded. Around half (52%) of these outcomes were sustained across all government entities.



Improvement/Disciplinary Action

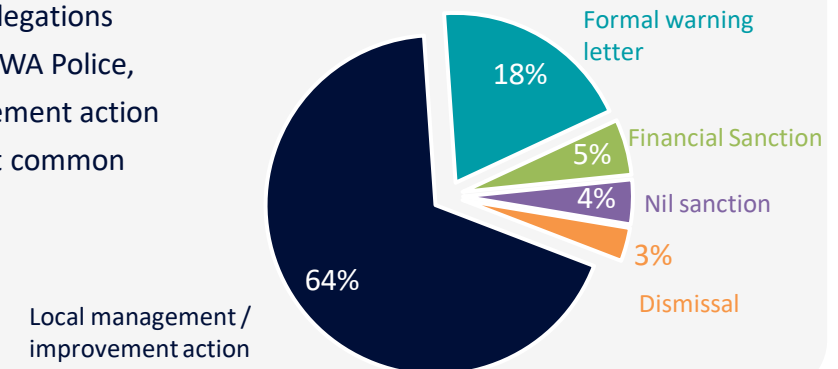
WA Govt Sector Entities

Of the 46 allegations that were sustained by WA Government entities, local improvement action and formal warning letter were the most common courses of action.



WA Police

Of the 125 allegations sustained by WA Police, local improvement action was the most common response.



Dismissals

14 public officers were recorded as being dismissed during the quarter.
