 QUINLAN, MR: If it please you, sir, this is a continuation of the public examinations. The next person to be examined is Mr Abdul Kader. I call Abdul Kader and I can advise you, sir, that Ms Greville acts for Mr Kader.

THE ACTING COMMISSIONER: Yes, can you please come forward, Mr Kader, and take a seat in the witness box please.

KADER, ABDUL called:

THE ACTING COMMISSIONER: Good morning, Ms Greville.

GREVILLE, MS: Sir, good morning. I seek leave to appear on behalf of Mr Kader.

THE ACTING COMMISSIONER: You have that leave, thank you.

GREVILLE, MS: Thank you, sir.

THE ACTING COMMISSIONER: Mr Kader, by section 138 subsection (1) of the CCC Act before conducting an examination of you for the purposes of an investigation under the act, I am required to inform you of the general scope and purpose of the investigation, unless in the circumstances I consider it is undesirable to do so. I do not consider it is undesirable and I now propose to explain the general scope and purpose to you. The general scope and purpose is to determine (1) if any public officer or former public officer employed by Curtin University of Technology has engaged in misconduct in connection with the conduct of the International English language testing system; (2) whether the policies, practices and operating environment of the Curtin English language centre were sufficient to detect misconduct in a timely manner; and (3) whether the International English language testing system has been compromised at testing centres operated by any other public authorities. Do you understand the terms of that general scope and purpose? ---Yes.

Before I commence the examination of you I require you to take an oath or an affirmation to tell the truth. Which would you prefer to take?---I'll take an oath.

Take an oath? Can I ask you to stand please and take the oath.

What was the purpose for you on the basis upon which you came to Australia?---I came as a student when I started - I essentially came as a student, part of Notre Dame and I did my masters of professional accounting there.

So you came on a student visa at the time?---That's correct, yes.

When you came to Australia on 2005 on the student visa, was it specifically to study for the master of professional accounting?---That's correct. Were you required, as part of that student visa, to satisfy any particular English language requirements? ---Yes, I did. I had to give an exam when I first came, and I had to give that exam again when I applied for my permanent residency. What was the kind of exam or test that you took for the

purposes of your English qualification? --- The first one was taken in India before I got here, and the second one was taken at ECU when - before, just before I applied for my permanent residency.

Were they both IELTS tests?---Yes.

So you first took an IELTS test in India prior to coming to Australia in August 2005?---Yes.

You're familiar, then, with the way in which the IELTS test operates?---Yes.

What band scores were you required to have for your student visa and - well, I'll ask you that first? ---I think at that time it was six, I believe, but I did receive a 5.5 in one of the categories but the university had accepted it and they had granted me to become a part of the university there.

So you received then in the test that you took in India - did you receive sixes for the other categories?---I had received six and above but only for one category I received a five and a half.

Then you said you took an IELTS test again at ECU when you applied for permanent residency. When was that?---My permanent residency was granted - I finished my course in September - I think I applied in September 2007 because my course took two years to complete, and then my permanent residency came through in 2008, I think mid-year sometime, and had given my PR between that period. I don't remember the exact date but I haven't brought any evidence regarding the date or anything, but I do have a copy of that.

But it was towards the middle of 2008 that you were granted permanent residency?---That's correct, yes.

So you obviously took the further IELTS test prior to that?---Yes.

And you took that at ECU?---Yes.

What were the band scores that achieved when you took the IELTS test at ECU prior to your permanent residency being granted?---I think the minimum in one of the categories I received I think was six. I don't remember off the top of my head but I had received six and six plus in the rest of the other categories.

Was that sufficient for the purposes of the granting of your permanent residency?---Yes.

Have you since changed the status upon which you are in Australia?---I'm an Australian citizen now.

And when did you become an Australian citizen?---I think it was towards starting or middle of last year.

Towards the start or middle of 2010?---Yes.

I want to ask you about some other persons to ask you whether you know them. Do you know a person by the name of Keith Low?---Yes.

What is the correct pronunciation of his surname?---Low.

How do you know Keith Low?---We were housemates when he moved over in 2006, middle; midyear 2006 he moved over into the house I currently live in.

So in the middle of 2006 you said he moved over?---He came from Malaysia to be a student in Murdoch University.

Eight to twelve thousand?---Yes.

How many people?---I don't remember. It could be anything between 20 to 25, but that number is just the top of my head because I don't - I mean, my involvement was only taking up - taking as an envelope from Pritesh and because Keith was living in that house, just pass it on to him and that was it.

So in relation to your involvement - and I'll ask you about the detail in a moment - you obviously don't have a record of the persons that you were involved with? ---That's correct. The people who actually sat, I didn't know them.

And you think that it could be about 25, but it could be more than that?---It could be less. I wouldn't think it would be anything more, as far as I'm aware. If Keith was doing anything on the other side that I'm not aware of, I have no idea.

You have mentioned Keith and I take it you're referring to Keith Low, who you were living with?---Yes, who I was living with.

You said that you provided envelopes to Keith Low, is that right?---Yes.

What was it that you provided to Keith Low?---The names on a piece of paper, and the money.

When you received money from Mr - - -?---Pritesh Shah.

-- Pritesh Shah, was it always from Pritesh Shah that you received money?---Yes.

Generally, how much money would you receive?---On - it ranged between 300 and maybe 1500 dollars, but it was initially 1500 for myself but that number came down pretty quickly to 300, 400 depending on what Pritesh had received and what he was ready to give me, and - because Keith, what we passed to Keith was \$1500 a person, with a name, and anything above that, what Pritesh would give me - say if he gave me 2000, I would keep the 500 and give Keith 1500.

So on every occasion, was it the case that the amount that Keith would be paid would be \$1500?---Yes, except for the first one.

 And you would go through the process of identifying how many there were and then determining how much money needed to go with them. Is that right?---Yes. So Pritesh knew that Keith would be receiving \$1500 per candidate?---That's correct.

 How did he know that?---He was a friend. He knew what was going on. I had told him. There was nothing hidden between me and Pritesh as to who was taking what and how this was all working and stuff.

You told him?---Told Pritesh, yes.

How much was required for Keith?---Keith taking - yes, exactly; that's right.

What I want to ask you is this: when was the first time you were involved in arranging for false test results to be produced at Curtin University?---Pritesh rang me up once, I think he was just talking, you know, just chatting and stuff and he discussed about his housemate applying for his permanent residency and I said, "Oh, good," and that's it, and then he goes, "But I don't think so it's going to happen because he's not going to be meeting the IELTS requirements for permanent residency, so I was like, "Oh, okay" and I didn't even think about it much, and he goes, "Do you know anybody who works in there?" so without even thinking I just said, "Yeah, there's a housemate of mine, Keith Low, who works there so he like, "Can you check with him can he do anything?" and so I just went out, knocked on his door, asked him, and he said, "Yeah, I can do something" and that was it, and then we came up with an amount and the first person was Vishal Pundya. I believe he was one of the witnesses.

You said that in that conversation - you had that conversation before you had spoken with Keith Low about it?---That was a conversation I had with Pritesh at the time and then I had a chat with - a conversation with Keith Low, that, "Is there something you can do?" and he said, "Yes."

I'm just going to read to you some of the evidence that Mr Shad, Pritesh Shah, gave when he was called before the Commission yesterday and then I will ask you to comment on it. This is what he said - in the first part of the question he is referring to Mr Pandya, Vishal Pandya? ---Yes.

So he was asked the question:

So he told you that and what did you do once he told you that?

Mr Shah's answer was - this is at page 309 of the transcript:

---I was a bit sad too because he was a very good friend of mine and I was like, "You can join the English class at Curtin which is going on," but he said it was too late. "Then you can practise more and get more CDs from the book shop or go to Curtin library or ECU" - because he was a student of ECU - "and practise at home." He said, "Yeah," and that's what I did. Then I went to a petrol station where I used to work and one of my mates said, "Why, are you serious?" and I was like, "One of my friends has got to go back to India because he couldn't get the band and he mentioned that he knows one guy and everything can be done."

Then he was asked:

 So who is this friend that you work with? ---Abdul, Abdul Kader.

Mr Shah's evidence appears to be that it was you who raised the possibility of obtaining false scores from somebody that you knew, based on asking Keith, I would have asked Keith, because on the phone Mr Shah said, "Are you going to be" - I mean, "My friend is applying a permanent residency and he's not going to get it." So I was like, "Okay, shame." And he said, "Is there anyone you know?" said, "Yeah I know of Keith who works in (indistinct) centre in Curtin University and I will ask him whether he can help out." That's when I asked Keith and he said, "Yeah, I will see what I can do" and that's what I conveyed to Mr Shah regarding the thing. All I remember is this was on the phone, but I'm sure I would have discussed this thing when I must have met him again in the petrol station or something like that, so - - -

Mr Shah also gave this evidence - at page 311 of the transcript - and the question relates to the conversation between you and Mr Shah. I will read you the earlier question. Ms Harries asked:

Are you saying in essence that because you had known Mr Kader for a number of years you trusted him? ---Yeah.

So when he told you about this method of paying to get the scores, you trusted what he told you?
---Yeah, first time, like when he say, I said, "Are you serious" and he said yeah, and I was like, "You sure?" And he said, "Yeah, don't worry, and this person, I know him, and he has done that before too."
So I said, "Okay, I'll tell Vishal and if he's happy you can do it."

And then he was asked:

Was this the first time that you knew that Mr Kader knew somebody who could get scores changed for money?---Yeah, that's my first time I knew.

And the answer was:

So despite the fact that the he told you that, Mr Kader told you that this person had done it before, you had never had any experience doing it before or knowing about Mr Kader doing it before? ---No, never.

Did you know whether Keith Low had done this before?---No. It only came to light when I went and asked him - when Pritesh told me about his housemate applying for a PR. That's the only time I actually went and asked him can he do something and he said yes. So if he's emphasising - I think when Mr Low said he could do it, I knew Keith wouldn't lie to me or wouldn't - I don't know if he's done it before. I'm not sure, but when he said he could do something, obviously there's a goodwill attached to when a friend tells you something. You rely on that thing and you go and tell that to another friend.

Yes?---You rely on that thing and you go and tell that to another friend.

Yes?---So that's on the basis of it happening. I don't know if Keith ever did anything before and I don't know - because I remember Vishal was the first person who got it done and this is how it all started.

Certainly Vishal was the first person that you were involved in?---That's correct.

 Are you saying now before the Commission that to this day you don't know whether Mr Low had done this before?
---That's correct. I don't know whether - I didn't know before that if Keith was ever involved in falsifying it.
I'm not sure, but from my knowledge Vishal was the first person because that one came through Pritesh.

When you asked Keith after Mr Shah had raised with you the problems that Vishal Pandya was having and you asked Keith whether he could do something, I think you said you knocked on his door or something like that?——This is all I remember: him being on the phone and he's asking me, "Do you know somebody who works in IELTS?" and I said, "Yes, I have a housemate who works in Curtin and he works for IELTS" so he's like, "Oh, okay. Can he do something?" So I said, "Hold on." I don't know whether it happened on the phone, while he was on the phone. I might have even disconnected and said, "I'll ask him later" or something and I might have just gone, knocked on his door and asked him, "Can you do something?" and then maybe he would call back to Pritesh saying yes, he can do something or whatever the case may be.

What I'm interested to know is, when the issue was raised with you, did you ask Keith Low straightaway?---I would have, yes.

Do you remember the occasion that you asked him?---Yes. He was in his room and that's when I asked him and he said yes, he should be able to do something.

So I take it when you say his room you are talking about the house that you shared?---Yes.

And when you asked him was he able to say yes immediately?--He didn't say like a yes or something. He said something
like - he just sort of nodded. That's all I remember. I
don't remember exactly because it was two and a half years
ago or something, but he did say yes. He gave a green
signal saying "I should be able to do something."

Really the point of my question is this: it was in the single conversation that you asked him and he confirmed

that he should be able to do something or something along those lines?---That's correct. Yeah; it's not like I asked him today and he came back five days later and he said, "Yeah, I should be able to." It happened on a face to face. I asked him and he said, "I'll see what I can do" or "I should be able to do something" and we said okay, good.

And you were able to tell Pritesh you were able to do that?---Yeah.

And you said that Mr Pandya - you then arranged for that to happen. Is that right?---That's correct.

What happened after that? Because I presume that you didn't talk about details at that point with Mr Low. How long after that was the next contact that you had about how it would be done?---For Vishal Pandya, or are you talking about someone - - -

Yes, for Vishal Pandya. I'm just talking about the first occasion it happened?---I don't remember, but if - once he must have said - all I can think of, once Keith Low must have told me, "Yes," I would have gone and conveyed that message to Pritesh and I believe Pritesh would have gone and told that to Vishal and Vishal would have gone and - I don't remember if Vishal already had a date and he was going to sit, or he went and got a date to sit for an exam after that. I'm not sure on that part.

 When was the price discussed or organised?---I believe I went - this is all I can remember, is being in Keith's room and ringing up Pritesh on the phone at the same time and asking how much he wanted, and then fixing up a price and then conveying to Pritesh, saying, "This is what Vishal has to give to get this done."

So you remember asking how much Keith wanted?---That's correct.

Asking Keith?---I mean, asking or - it was a friendly thing so it was more like saying, "How much do you need?" and he came up with a figure or something, maybe he kind of said, "This much," or - I don't remember the exact thing, but this is what I remember from the top of my head, that I must have asked him or I asked him and - it was like, I remember Pritesh was on the phone at the same time and I said, "Okay, this is what your friend should be - you should go and tell your friend to give, because - yeah, and then that should be enough."

So you were in Mr Low's presence?---That's correct.

You were together?---Yes.

And you also - - -?---Had Pritesh on the phone, and I was discussing that with Mr Low as to how much he thought he would need, or how much he wants, and then we coming up with - "Okay, you want this much, and then you should be telling this much to Vishal to get it all - - -"

What did Mr Low say was the figure at that time, the amount of money - - -?--I remember the first one was, he took 900 and we charged Mr Pandya, I think, 1500.

1500?---And I believe I must have taken three or four hundred and the remaining Pritesh took it, but that figure could be either or, but I know - I think Vishal gave 1500 but I could be wrong.

- - - Mr Pandya, was that conversation at the same time as when you initially asked Mr Low whether he could do it or was it on later occasion?---I don't remember, seriously. It could be on the - I mean, if I had asked Mr Low then then I believe there would be some time because I had to obviously deliver that message to Pritesh, Pritesh would have gone and had a chat with Vishal, Vishal would have thought about it maybe. I don't know know whether it happened on the same spot, on the same day, or did it happen maybe after a couple of days or something. I'm not a hundred per cent sure.

But at any rate, there was discussion with Mr Low as to how much he wanted and then a figure was come up with to come ultimately from Mr Pandya?---Vishal, yes.

After that was done - and let me go back a little - when you were talking with Pritesh Shah about this and you had said, "I know somebody in Curtin University," did you tell Pritesh who the person was?---Yes, I would have told him that it is a housemate of mine.

Would you have told him his name?---I would have.

 So between you and Mr Shah there was no secret, if you like, as to who you were dealing with?---No. There was no secret regarding the money that Mr Keith would want and there was no secret regarding who was doing it, so Pritesh was essentially in on - he exactly knew what was going on. So at the end, towards the end, I was just like a middle person, taking it from Pritesh and Pritesh knew exactly how much Keith wanted, so he would essentially just come with - saying, "This is for Keith, this is for yourself," and just leave and I would just pass it on.

Once the price had been talked about, was there discussion in relation to when the money would need to be paid?---It used to be before the person sitting but I think - - -

Just so I'm clear, I'm talking at the moment about when you first arranged it for Mr Pandya, so the first time that you are talking about it. What was discussed in relation to when the money would need to be paid?---I think it was paid before Mr Pandya sat for his test. That's all I remember but - because I think Keith was - Keith was adamant that obviously it shouldn't be after because if he had to - he just wanted an assurance basically in terms of the cash, that, "Yes, I'm going to do it." If obviously there was no cash, he would not do it because what's the point doing something and not getting paid for it or something, so.

So in your discussions with Keith, he was adamant that the money had to be paid upfront?---Yes, before the - maybe 90 per cent of the time that was the case where people obviously were sitting, say, for example - I think the test usually used to run on a Saturday and he would get the money maybe on a Friday or even a week before, depending on who was giving it and where it was coming from and stuff,

 Did Mr Low, when the arrangements were being made on this first occasion, tell you how he was going to do it?---This wasn't - I think not - may not have been discussed on the first instance but all the period of time when this was happening I obviously had to talk with him and, you know, in a conversation he did mention how he was changing it. Like I remember asking him, "How are you doing it?" It may not be on the first instance but over a period of time that this was happening, and he said he was changing the scores in the system and he did mention something about him using different person's login IDs, to log in into a computer or - I think which was not his and changing the scores from there.

 Did he say why - it might sound obvious but did he say why he was using different person's logins?---I mean, when he said he was using I think he just hint that obviously he's trying to avoid - if something had to go wrong later on they wouldn't completely come and blame him for it sort of thing, but it wasn't like - it may not have been spoken for word to word but I suppose it's commonsense that you pick it up and say, "Why is he using it?" because his name doesn't show up anywhere.

Did he - and I appreciate that this might not have been before the first occasion but later - tell you anything else that he did in relation to the records of the tests when he was arranging for the scores to be changed?---In one of the occasions he did mention that - I think - like

I think the question then I suppose we thought about was, "If he's going to change it, then if someone picked it up and said" - if the test score is saying four but on the system it's showing a seven, then obviously someone would ask a question from the internal side of things, like, "How is someone getting a four on the script but you have given a seven on the system?" and he did say that he was trying to do something to rectify that problem, and I believe - I don't know exactly how he did it but he did mention or was trying to - I don't know, maybe change the answer or change the score on the piece of paper or something, I don't know.

So while he said to you that he definitely was able to change the scores in the computer system using other people logons, he was also trying to find a way that the test result forms would actually match what was in the computer system?---That's where essentially a person has written the answers, change it over there as well, so if someone picked it up - - -

And in your discussions with him were you informed whether he was actually able to achieve that in any case?---To be quite honest, I suppose that was really not my concern and I was really not bothered how he did it I suppose, yeah.

Did you communicate what you'd understood about that to Pritesh in terms of the way he was able to do it?---I don't remember. I must have spoken about it or him when present with Keith, and when Keith must have mentioned it and he must have heard it as well.

When was the last occasion that you recall being involved in arranging for these results to be changed?---This was, I think, in June last year. I was flying to India. I flew to India that night and I remember meeting him and giving him the names and the cash because the exam I think happened after I had gone to India, and that was the last instance where he was supposed to change it because when I got back I think he had already left his job or he had resigned and he was finishing up over there. I'm not sure, but that was the case; that was the last instance. I think it was June 2010.

Do you remember when you went to India?---It was sometime in June.

Do you remember whether it was the beginning or the end? ---I think it could have been - I should be able to find out from my passport. I don't have it here but I think it was 9 or 10 June or something. I'm not sure.

There was a test taken on 5 June 2010 by a number of persons. Could it be that occasion which was the one you are referring to when you - - -?--No. I think it was after that. I'm not a hundred per cent sure but I remember when he quit - I think the last one was just before he quit. I'm not sure.

 There were also some tests taken at the end of June, I think on 26 or 27 June. You don't remember?---I came back I think in - I was gone for exactly 30 days and I think I came back in July sometime.

Right?---So by the time I got back the test was actually done.

The occasion that you went to India, do I understand you to say that you were involved in part of the arrangements for that but not all of them. Is that right?---I don't understand.

You said that the test was taken while you were away? ---Yes.

But you remember giving the money before you left? --- That's correct.

On that occasion were there a number of persons? Was it more than one lot of \$1500?---Yes.

It was?---But I remember Keith, I don't know, something had gone wrong and Pritesh had to pay back, that's what I remember. I'm not a hundred per cent sure, but I think I might have gone and even taken some cash from Keith, or maybe it could have been a different occasion altogether. I'm not sure.

Something went wrong on that occasion?---Maybe that occasion, or maybe an occasion before that or - not sure.

I may come to the detail of that one later, but do you remember in particular that there was an occasion when a person came from interstate to take the test, a woman came from interstate to take the test?——I remember Pritesh mentioning that there was someone coming from interstate to do it, but I don't have the specifics of who that person was and when that person came in to do it. I mean, I really — to be quite honest, I kept my knowledge as short as possible because Pritesh was the one who was getting it and Keith was doing it, so I was sort of just the middle person, passing the names and the money from one hand to the other; so the specifics of how it happened, what Keith did, what he was doing inside and how Pritesh was getting people, I kept my knowledge very little in that regard.

I have jumped forward a little, so I will just go back to the first occasion and just confirm this: after you had talked about price and what was involved and so on, did Keith tell you what needed to be provided to him in order for this to be done?---I think it was just a name and maybe an candidate ID number, because I think every individual who sat I think had a unique candidate ID number or something; so I suppose he was happy to get that and we could match it up saying, "Okay, yeah, this is the person."

Other than the occasions on which the payment was made after the test was taken, was the money and the candidate number and the name provided to Keith at the same time? ---Sorry, say that again.

Leaving aside the occasions where there was a payment made after the test was taken, I think you said 90 per cent of the time the payment would be made before the test was taken?---Yes.

So on those occasions when the payment was made before the test was taken, were the names and candidate numbers always given to Keith with the money?---There were times when, maybe it must have happened once I believe, I don't know, but the money was given first and I remember asking Pritesh what are the names, and he said he doesn't have them yet because the guy hasn't given it to him or something, and then later it might have come through a piece of paper or an SMS or something like that, so then it was passed on.

Other than Keith Low and Pritesh Shah, do you know other persons who were involved in this arrangement?---Pritesh did mention, talking about a guy called Rajesh Kumar and I think I met him maybe on two occasions, I believe. Because when it started, Pritesh had a few friends who wanted or who were applying for their PRs and could get this done, but Pritesh's friends sort of dried up very quickly and I don't know how he found this guy, but he found this guy who had, I suppose, a number of people who wanted to get their results falsified, and Rajesh Kumar, I think I met him, I think maybe two times or three times. I don't remember exactly, but he was the one who had the persons and so from there - so Rajesh gave it Pritesh and Pritesh came and gave it to me and then I gave it to Keith.

So in the times when Rajesh Kumar was involved, the money would effectively pass through from the test taker to Rajesh, to Pritesh Shah, to you, to Keith?---That's correct.

So there would be five persons, effectively, who would have had the money at one point?---That's right, unless Rajesh got it from somewhere else. I wouldn't have a clue. If there was someone else passing on to - like, not the test taker but someone else was passing on to Rajesh, I wouldn't have a clue.

Yes. Where did you meet Rajesh? You said you met him one or two times?---Maybe a few times or something. I think it was in the night. Maybe I met him outside his house in Kardinya, outside on North Lake Road or something. One of the apartments or something somewhere, because I remember going with Pritesh. We had - once I went to get the cash, I went with Pritesh. Pritesh said, "Do you want to come along?" and I said, "Okay," and he got the money and the names, I believe, then. Then I met him a couple more times after.

Did you have any direct contact with Rajesh Kumar in relation to organising particular test results to be changed?---No.

So there weren't occasions upon which you - - -?---Which I would not contact Rajesh Kumar directly, no. I mean, it always went through Pritesh but like I said, I have met Rajesh on a couple of occasions but obviously Pritesh was always present there. It was never me calling up Rajesh directly and saying, "Let's keep Pritesh out or something." No.

But you certainly had met him?---Yes.

Is it possible that you had some very limited telephone contact with him?---With Rajesh?

Yes?---I did, I think, contact him once or twice on request by Pritesh.

So there would be occasions upon which Pritesh would ask you to contact Rajesh Kumar?---Something - I think maybe once or twice or something, on one or two occasions or something, Keith wasn't able to falsify them properly or something, where the original mark sheet or something had gone to the person's place so obviously there was an uproar, saying, "We have paid and you haven't done it," so Rajesh was a bit hesitant to bring any more in considering the fact that it wasn't happening what was supposed to happen and Pritesh, I think, made me the scapegoat in that, to ring up Rajesh saying that he worked for the university or something, just to try and explain him that, "Look, it's not a problem, this will be fixed and you should have your original one at your place or he can come pick it up from Pritesh or something like that."

 Do I understand by that answer, when that happened - and I'll identify the occasion a little later - on the occasions where there had been a problem and Keith hadn't been able to change the scores and the correct scores had gone out, Rajesh Kumar was upset about it?---Yes. Well, I mean, if someone is making you upset you're going to take it out on someone else and it sort of passes on the line, I guess.

Yes, so Pritesh asked you to ring him, in effect, to say, "Well, look, I know that it's going to be okay," to give some assurance to Rajesh Kumar that Pritesh might not have been able to give?---Yes, exactly. That's right.

Was there anybody else that you met in relation to these arrangements?---What do you mean? I mean, as in people sitting the test or people being involved in - - -

During that year, as the year went by, was it a constant number of persons that you were obtaining money from or did the numbers grow as time went on?---It grew as the time went on. I mean, initially I remember on starting, I think there was like one, then one came after maybe a few weeks or something but I think when Rajesh got involved - and this is what I remember from Pritesh - the number got higher because I think Rajesh had a fair few people that were going to be applying for their PRs or something.

So at first it would have more occasionally and it would be friends of Pritesh?---Pritesh.

 Later it became more of an operation where strangers were coming into the picture?---That's right. I mean, the strangers were to us, but they could have been friends with Rajesh I believe or Pritesh. I don't know.

You mentioned Harinder Jit was somebody you knew?---That's correct.

 Do you also remember there being an occasion where Mr Jit's wife wanted to obtain a IELTS result?---Yeah. I remember Pritesh talking about it, saying Harinder's wife needed it as well when he gave the money.

Do you remember her name?---I think her name - I read it in the news. I don't remember it like I know her because I've never seen her before but from the news her name was I think Simarpreet Kaur.

In relation to Simarpreet Kaur, I think she took the test

For most of the people who were taking the test, what did you understand they wanted the test for?---I was believing they required it for their permanent residency or some occasions where they were trying to extend their student visa, and I think there was a requirement there for extending their student visa, and you have to sit for that test again as well, so, yes.

Were there particular scores that you were aware they required for the purposes of those?---It was more based on what they sort of wanted. So if they said they wanted a seven, then seven it was, and I believe, I think, Simarpreet wanted a higher score or something and she said - I'm not a hundred per cent sure but I suppose that's what she got or something, yeah.

How was that communicated, how was the particular score arranged and communicated to be provided?---Most likely on most of the instances it would usually be a seven score. think that was the minimum required or something, and then I think people - you know, any person would think that if you got seven in each one of them, I suppose because towards the end I remember seeing someone asking for seven in one band, seven and a half in the other one, I think just to keep it up and down so that maybe someone picked it up straightaway, then we would not think, "Why has this person got seven in each one of them" or something, or something of that sort, but initially or most of the time it was a seven, that's what they were after, but on certain instances I remember on a piece of paper when the names were given the little scores were written down as well and this person needs this sort of score in whatever category, whether listening, reading or whatever, and that's what it was.

So in addition to the names, the candidate number - - -? ---Initially, it wasn't, but towards the end there were - on a piece of paper there would be written as well saying, "This person requires a seven in this, a seven and a half in the other one, six and a half in the other one," I'm not sure, but whatever it was.

So initially at first there weren't particular scores asked for, but later on you would see it written down? ---Yes.

Would that sound all right?---Yes, because I remember it was never more, I've never taken more than 1500, from the top of my head. It was initially that way, but I think soon the thing changed where I suppose maybe Pritesh wants to realise I'm doing all the hard work, so why is he taking so much, or whatever the case may be, and it sort of went down to 300 and he's like, "That's all you're going to get" and it was like that, whatever.

On that occasion, if you received \$2300 would it still be the case that 1500 would go to Mr Low?---Yeah.

And other than the occasion with Mr Pandya, is that the case with all of the transactions you were involved in, that Mr Low would always get \$1500?---There might be one occasion when he might have taken more than 1500, but I'm not exactly sure what that figure was. It could be 1600 or 17, I mean maybe a couple of hundred dollars more.

On 7 November 2009, tests were taken by two persons, a Chirag Dhirwani and Punit Kanjiya. Do you recognise those names?---No.

As friends of Pandya?---I don't know anybody, I don't know anyone, I mean Vishal was friends with.

 But you don't dispute that you may have been involved in that because you didn't keep a record of the names?
---That's correct. I'm not saying I wasn't involved or anything, I'm just saying I don't personally know that person.

On both of those occasions Mr Shah has indicated that he received \$5000 and that he paid 3000 to you which would be divided each way with Mr Low?---Mm.

Does that sound consistent with what you were doing? ---Yeah; yes.

What were you doing with the money?---Just essentially paying off the regular, you know, rent and groceries and everything and maybe bought a few clothes or something with it, yeah.

So do I take it that it was all received in cash obviously?---That's correct.

For the most part did you spend the cash rather than put it in the bank?---That's correct.

On some occasions did you put cash in the bank?---I might have.

After 7 November the next test taken was on 21 November 2009. A person called Navin Bhudiya took the test. Do you remember that person's name?---No.

 Again he I think - Mr Shad indicated that he received 4000 or 4500 dollars from Mr Bhudiya and retained part of it and paid the rest to you. You would agree that that could have happened and you just don't remember the name? ---That's right. I mean, whatever people actually sat through, Pritesh had always gone through me.

Yes?---So if he is saying - I mean, probably his memory is really good, mine is just maybe shabby or something but yeah, I agree with - if Pritesh had passed it on to me, it will have come through me and would have gone to Keith.

As far as you knew Pritesh always had to go through you? --- That's correct.

And that he didn't deal directly with Keith Low?---No; no. I mean, he was available or he would have come at certain occasions along with me as well but he wouldn't - I mean, there was always a conversation between me and Keith and he was part of it but he wouldn't go by himself, ringing up Keith himself and saying, "I've got two (indistinct)," or something. He would never do that.

On 5 December Rajesh Kumar - - -?---Yeah, that's the guy.

 I'm having some difficulty hearing you. Could you just adjust the microphone or sit a little bit closer and it might be easier to hear? Thank you. I have taken you to the end of 2009, through that first six months of 2009 and the ones that Mr Shah has indicated have been about nine people in that six-month period?---Okay.

Which, as you said, was - it wasn't as often?---It was very occasional, here and then sort of.

Very occasional?---There were more coming through.

Do you remember something happening at the end of 2009 or discussing with Mr Low at the end of 2009 that there might be changes to the IELTS system that would affect what you were doing?---I vaguely remember him talking about they could become - I think they were trying to revamp the system or something of that sort and it was a general conversation, saying it might be harder or something to do it and he probably wouldn't be able to do it or something. That's something I remember that Keith mentioned, but I think it never happened or it didn't go through, I don't know what happened but yeah, I remember something of that sort Keith mentioning.

Was that towards the end of 2009?---I don't know.

He raised that there might be a problem as a result of changes that might be happening which would mean you would need to stop but in fact it didn't stop?---No, it didn't stop.

 So whatever he thought might have - whatever he had said to you might be going to occur as far as you know didn't? ---It probably didn't or even if it did and he got a way around it, I don't know.

On 9 January there was a test taken by a Poojan Khakhar. Does that name mean anything to you?---No.

On 6 February there was a test taken by a Dalwinder Singh. It doesn't mean anything to you?---I'm probably hearing that name again but I don't know what that person looks like or - - -

Dalwinder Singh gave evidence earlier this week to the effect that he paid a person called Lovejeet Singh who - he didn't know where the money went from there. Do you know a Lovejeet Singh?---I never heard of the name before.

So if that was the arrangement, that he'd paid a person called Lovjeet Singh, and the money ultimately came through to Mr Low, that would be an additional person in the chain, if you like. You didn't know about Lovejeet Singh, if Lovejeet Singh was dealing with Mr Kumar or Mr Shah?--- Yeah.

I've asked you about Mr Jit's wife. You remember her because she had asked for higher scores than sevens?---And apart from that, Pritesh had mentioned that I think she was the first woman - put it this way: she was the first woman or something and Pritesh mentioned that she was Harinder's girlfriend, wife; I'm not sure what the status is like but he did mention that.

I think he said in relation to her that he received \$3200 from her, and as was often the case he paid \$3000 to you which was divided equally between you and Mr Low?---Okay. Would have been - I don't remember.

When you would receive money from Mr Shah, did you know how much he had received in the first instance?——Some occasions he did mention but towards the end I don't know whether — I mean, if he's coming and telling me I've got to — say, \$2500, so I'm taking \$500 and giving you \$2000, I wouldn't be a hundred per cent sure whether he was actually getting 2000 because there was no way I would have gone and checked how much he got because I never went with him to get the money in the first instance.

I want to ask you about - and most of the examples I've given so far have been about one or two people taking the test at a particular time?---Mm'hm.

I want to ask you about a test that was taken on 6 March 2010, and on 6 March 2010 in addition to Harinder Jit's wife Simarpreet Kaur there were three other persons who took the test on that occasion, a Sukhdeep Buttar, a Satinderpal Sidhu and a Satinderpal Gil, three men. Do you remember any of those names?---No.

You may not remember the names but I want to ask you some things about the occasions. Mr Shah has given evidence to the Commission that these were people who I think for the first time asked him to arrange the test. They had been introduced by Navin, but they wanted to pay after they had taken the test?---I think there was an occasion once where I think they paid half first and they said, "You are going to get half later" or something but I think - I'm not sure if I communicated that with Keith. I'm sure Keith would have declined it because he obviously wanted to get whatever he was going to get up front rather than do half now and half later. I'm not sure how that went but I remember there was an occasion where someone came up and said, "They're not going to give you the whole thing right

now but they'll give it to you later" like, half now, half later or something like that.

this is Mr Shah -

"Okay, but I have to ask them," because he said, like, these people, they're probably not going to pay in the beginning, no amount. I said, "I'm not sure, but otherwise this guy, he's not going to help," so he said, "But he had already taken a date on my saying because I told them that, 'Okay, look, do take a date and I'll probably help you.'"

and Mr Shah responded:

"But you shouldn't have done that because I'm not the one doing this thing. I have people, you know, in front of me. I have to ask to ask them. If they're happy, they can help. If they're not, I'm sorry," and he said, "Please request them." So I made a phone call in front of him but I speak Hindi, but he doesn't know who I'm talking to and I told him, like, "This is going on -"

and this is a reference to you -

and he said, "I'm at work. When I go home, I talk to Keith and I'll let you know," so he came back in

 That Mr Shah effectively reverted to you before confirming that it could be done, that they would not pay before the test?---I don't remember clearly, but I know there was something going on where someone came along the way and said they're not going to pay up-front, or they want to pay half or something of that sort, and I believe that got sorted because they did sit and ended up paying us and the money did get transferred over.

In relation to those persons that took the test on 6 March 2010, one of them, Mr Gill, gave evidence before the Commission on Tuesdays that he paid but then he received in the mail - he received a certificate and he didn't receive the certificate that he wanted. Do you remember there being any difficulties associated with somebody having got a certificate that they - - -?---I don't remember whether this was that instance but I do remember maybe on one occasion or maybe on one occasion or maybe a couple of occasions where the actual certificate had gone home and Keith was obviously made aware and he said he was going to reprint a new one with the scores requested and he's going to deliver those ones. It could have gone through the mail or he could have given it to me and I could have gone and passed it on to Pritesh and so on and so forth.

Do you remember that on occasion there were occasions where you would actually be given the test certificate in order to give to Mr Shah?---That's correct, yes.

And how many times, to your memory, would have happened?--- Maybe twice. I don't know, but it did happen, yes.

On 27 March two more persons sat the test, Ajit Singh and Jatin Dutta. Do those names mean anything to you?---No.

But you wouldn't question, for example, Pritesh Shah's memory that they were two persons who were arranged as well?---Yes.

That month, the month of March, therefore seems to have been - and I think there was another person on 27 March - there were two more people on 27 March as well, Anuj Vaidya and Keyurkumar Patel. Do those names mean anything to you?---No.

That suggests that in the month of March there were eight people who took the test in that month on two separate occasions. Is it fair to say that by March this activity was getting pretty busy?---Yes. I'm not going to say March or April or whatever but I know towards the end of it he did get - there were quite a few on each test date. It wasn't like on person on one test date or something. It could've been two, could've three, something of that sort.

On 17 April 2010 there was a Jaswinder Sidhu who sat the test, and a person by the name of Maninder. Do you remember either of those names?---No.

They were both in April. In May it doesn't appear this happened at all on any occasion in May. Do you remember whether or not you or Mr Low or Mr Shah were away at all

Yes?---I'm not sure what time he left, but we did meet up over there. I'm not a hundred per cent sure if - - -

But May you're not sure about?---No.

In June I think you said that you went to India and Pritesh went as well, but he went a little later than you?---Later or before me, I'm not a hundred per cent sure.

Do you remember at that time whether, because you were leaving before Pritesh that Pritesh for that reason dealt directly with Mr Low? Was there a discussion about that? ---I met Pritesh, on the day I left, Pritesh was still here. I think Pritesh left after me.

So Keith had asked, when that happened, to your knowledge, that the false one, when that was handed over, the true one would be given back?---Yes.

What happened with it?---I don't know. He - Keith took it back. I don't know what he did with it but he just said, "I want it back," and we were like, "Okay."

Back to 5 June, there was a Tusharkumar Patel?---Don't remember.

Rikenkumar Vaishnani?---Don't remember.

Okay. Mr Vaishnani, as I indicated, took the test in June and you were away for at least part of June. I'm going to ask you some questions about what happened with him and whether you remember any of this?---Sure.

Mr Vaishnani paid \$10,000 through Rajesh Kumar originally?--Okay.

He gave evidence. After he took the test, he received the test report form that had the true scores on it, ie the ones that he didn't want?---Okay.

He contacted Rajesh Kumar and Rajesh Kumar told him to go back and get another one, that is pay for another test report form, and that one was the correct scores as well? ---Mm'hm.

So he had got two, and that he then was told by Rajesh Kumar that Rajesh Kumar would arrange for another one and another one was produced on the same day which had the false scores on it. Do you understand the description of what I'm giving to you? And that second occasion, where he got two that are marked the same date, is 28 June 2010. Do you have any recollection of being involved in that?

---No. I remember there were a few calls made to me while I was in India by Pritesh, when he was in India as well, saying something along the lines that something had happened wrong. I don't remember the names or anything but I do remember contacting Keith and saying, "Look, something has gone wrong. You haven't changed it properly or something like that." I did notify Keith about it.

You do remember that while you were in India in June of 2010, when Pritesh was there as well, something had gone

Large deposits like that where your family, for example, were assisting you, would go directly into the bank account?---That's correct. You were receiving some cash as a result of these transactions involving Mr Low?---Mm'hm. And it can be up to 1000 or 1500 dollars at a time?---Yes. Other than your receipt of cash in those transactions, was there any other source of cash that you were receiving over this year?---No. No?---It was just the salary and that's it. Looking at that bank statement - if I can ask to go to page 4; scrolling down - there's a cash deposit at Nedlands on 9 November 2009 at 12.05 pm, do you see that, of a thousand dollars?---Yes. A cash deposit of that size, would that be a cash deposit of the cash that you were receiving as a result of the transactions with Mr Low?---Could be.

There is no other source of a thousand dollars in cash that you can think of for that period of time?---No.

If we can move forward to page 8 of that - stopping there - you can see that on 25 March 2010 there is a cash deposit of \$2000 and on 29 March 2010 there is a cash deposit of \$1900. Do you see them?---Yes.

Do you agree that those cash deposits in that four-day period or five-day period of \$3900 are likely to be from the cash that you had received as a result of these transactions involving Mr Low?---Yes.

Indeed, that deposit of that \$3900 in the two amounts happened in a month in which there was a lot of activity, that is a lot of persons went through the process?---Yes.

Then, finally, if I can ask you to go to the last page, page 10, you can see on 8 June 2010 there's a cash deposit of Willetton of \$3000?---Mm'hm.

Would you agree that a cash deposit of that size is likely to be cash associated with the transactions involving Mr Low?---Yes.

Again, that cash deposit happened shortly after the large number of persons taking the test on 5 June?---That's correct.

Judging by those cash deposits over that period of time that I have identified, there seemed to be a total of \$7900 that was deposited in your bank account in relation to these transactions. Would you agree with that?---I would say so yes.

Given your evidence earlier that most of the money that you received you actually spent and didn't put in the bank, that would suggest that the total amount of money that you received was significantly in excess of \$7900?

---Yes. I would agree with that, yes.

You don't know exactly how much you received because you didn't keep a running total.

 GREVILLE, MS: (indistinct) it does disclose information that isn't relevant to these particular proceedings, including identifying persons and entities and things like that.

 THE ACTING COMMISSIONER: We have made suppression orders for similar documents earlier where the residential address is suppressed and the bank account number is suppressed, but we have not suppressed the contents of the document, but perhaps I will hear from Mr Quinlan first.

QUINLAN, MR: I have certainly taken the witness to particular entries in the course of the document. There's no necessary requirement for the disclosure of the balance of it for the purposes of a proper understanding of the document. It's not clear from looking at the document, as I said, on the screen that there are particular matters, however, that are likely to cause any prejudice or difficulty to persons, but if it were your view that the document should otherwise not be the subject of publication, of course that should not apply to anything I have referred to in the transcript.

THE ACTING COMMISSIONER: You don't need any other entries in the bank account statement in the context and to explain the entries that you have taken the witness to?

QUINLAN, MR: I took him to some of the entries for the purposes of the context.

THE ACTING COMMISSIONER: You don't need to rely on any (indistinct)

 QUINLAN, MR: No, and I think on the basis that he has accepted that the \$7900 obviously reflects, in all likelihood, the moneys the subject of the transactions, in this particular instance I don't identify any particular other matter which would prejudice the investigation if that were included.

 THE ACTING COMMISSIONER: Yes. I make an order that there will be no publication of Mr Kader's residential address, nor the bank account number referred to in Commission document exhibit number 0424, that should be bar code 0424, nor any of the other entries in the document save for the entries to which counsel took Mr Kader, and a written form of that suppression order will issue shortly.

Why was that?---Because I knew that the top was going to fall away any time. It did fall away anyway, but - so because I think it had just gone too big and it was all supposed to be expected or something like that.

If Pritesh wasn't there then this probably would have never happened or - I wouldn't have trusted anyone else to bring in anyone, because obviously it sort of gives a thing that anyone can just go and speak it out to anyone and people will know about it or something like that, so - yeah.

So from your point of view, you trusted Pritesh that if he was dealing with you and he was dealing with other people, that he was somebody who was not going to reveal your involvement?---Not that, really. I mean, I just mean it in the way that he - because of the time this started happening he was still a student, so obviously he had a fair few students that he was studying with who might want to get this done or something, so he said he should be able to get some, get a few people or something, so yeah, and I wasn't studying then or I was already a PR and the friends of mine were all settled in. Nothing of that sort was going on anyway and I don't have - I don't keep in touch with a lot of people, so - -

What his job was?---No. I just knew he was working and he was running the test, or being the coordinator essentially. So you knew he was the coordinator at the IELTS centre? ---That's correct. Did you know how many other people worked with him? --- No. Did you know anybody else at the Curtin English language centre?---No.

Had you ever been there before this happened?---No, no; not to occur in university, no.

You had not visited him at work or anything like that? ---No.

It was being made clear by you to Mr Low when you approached him that you were asking him to falsify the test reports. Correct?---I didn't understand the gravity of what was going to happen. All I knew was Pritesh was asking if there was something that can be done to essentially get Mr Pandya the PR or make him eligible to get his PR, and I without even thinking I just went and asked him and he said, "I can try, what I can do."

I take it that when you had that conversation with him you weren't talking, for example, about him finding some legitimate way for Mr Pundya to get better at English so he could pass the test, were you?---No, that's correct. I wasn't asking him for him to - a class or anything.

Put him in touch with a tutor or a class or something like that?---No.

What you were raising with Mr Low was is there some way we can get around the system in order to get him the results that he wants?---That's right.

And when it was raised with you by Mr Shah that Vishnal Pandya was having these problems, I think on your evidence you fairly quickly went to Mr Low and asked him?---Because he was just right there in the house.

Yes. What made you think that you could go to Mr Low and effectively ask him to use his job to circumvent - to get around - the proper IELTS system?---I wasn't expecting to get a positive answer right away. I just went to ask him whether he could do something or he knew someone who could do something and he said, "I can try" or "I'll see what I can do" and that was it. Then he said that, yes, he can do it.

Would you agree with me that it's quite an unusual thing to say to somebody - - -?---I mean, I would go to an IELTS centre and ask someone who could do this but I suppose I took him as a friend, and since I'd known him for a while, and asked him that question. Obviously he could have said no. He could have said yes, depending on what he wanted to do. I mean, it's like any other friend. You just go and ask them, whatever, and I think it's up to them to justify or define or judge for themselves what they're

going to be doing is right or wrong, so that was essentially what I had gone and asked on that basis. If he had said no, I would be like, "Okay."

But there can't have been any doubt in your mind when you went to ask him, that you knew you were asking him whether he could do something which was wrong?---I mean, I hadn't quite thought of it then. Like, it's something that someone's asked you something; you don't sit down, think about what you are going to ask; you just go and ask. If that person said no, then obviously you ask them why they're saying no or if they've said yes, awesome. That was the answer you were probably looking for anyway. So if they said no or something probably I would sit down with them and I'd say why is it no or something, and he would have then gone and explained it to me, but he just said yes, so you don't really think whether, I suppose - okay, yeah, this is probably the answer you are looking for in the first place, so that's what you got from him.

"Can you do something?" and he said, "I'll think about it" or "Nothing to worry about. Yeah, I can try and do something."

Because as you have said, he seemed to have given you a positive response pretty immediately?---Exactly, so I'm not going to - that's the answer that I was looking for because my friend was expecting something, a positive response back from him. Not - if he had said no or something then I would be like, "Okay, fair enough. Why?" and then, because that's the reason why. If I rang up Pritesh and tell him that, "Look, he said no," he's going to - first thing he's going to ask me, "Why is he saying no?" and I need to give him answer, and that would be the answer what I get back from him.

How did you first become aware that that had happened?
---Pritesh came and told me that the people who had
actually sat the test had got a letter from, I think from
the IELTS centre or from somewhere, the immigration
department or something, saying that the IELTS test score
that he received is due to an inadvertent error or
something, there was in error in there and the score that
he got is not right, or something of that sort. So I had
heard it from Pritesh, I believe.

So Pritesh told you that various test takers had received a letter - - -?---Had received a letter.

- - - saying, "Your scores were wrong, they're going to be changed"?---That's - they were wrong, and that's all I heard.

Just tell us what was said between you and Mr Low?---I just filled him in as in this is what I heard and I think that's all I remember, that I did ring him up. I got his phone number from one of our other friends and called him up and I told him, "I think this is what happened" and I don't remember what happened after that but I just briefed him as in this is what happened; they got letters and stuff like that.

And what did he say?---I don't remember exactly what he said or how he reacted or anything but I just told him that this had happened.

Did you express concern to him about the fact that the incorrect nature of the results had been discovered?

---I would have told him. I don't exactly remember how the conversation went but I just remember that I rang him up and I told him that this had happened.

Put it this way: did he say anything to allay your concerns about your and his involvement being revealed? ---We had expected that I think, that if something had to go a different way, then all this would have been revealed as in who was involved and everything of that sort.

 Did he say whether he thought he had done enough so that your and his involvement wouldn't be revealed?---I think it was more like he had done enough, that his involvement, what he was doing in there wouldn't be revealed based on the fact that he had used different logon names to log into the system to change it.

 So he did express to you that from his point of view he thought that while they may have discovered the results weren't correct, they wouldn't work out who had done it or if it had been done by manipulating the system?---I mean, not exactly word for word that way but that was the notion I received from him; this is what he was trying to say, that if they had picked it up, they wouldn't exactly come and point fingers at him because of the way he had done it.

And if they didn't point fingers at him, that is, if his involvement wasn't revealed, how did that make you feel about the prospect that your involvement might be revealed?---I sort of always knew that it might come down anyway, because if it's not going to be picked up from there, they will pick it up from the person who actually sat there and will start pointing fingers to each other.

At that time was there any talk of the people who had received the letters from IELTS wanting their money back? ---Pritesh did mention that, yes.

He did mention that?---Yeah.

And what effectively did you and Pritesh discuss about that?---There was no money to give back. I don't remember exactly but I remember there was nothing to give back.
