




Overview of Serious Misconduct

REPORTS AND NOTIFICATIONS



770 reports and notifications were received during the quarter, consistent with previous quarters.



ALLEGATIONS ASSESSED


1165 allegations of serious misconduct were assessed during the quarter.

446 of these allegations were assessed as involving suspected serious misconduct.

In taking action, the Commission:


- did not need to act further concerning **208** of these allegations;
- referred **155** to respective agencies for action
- recorded the action already taken by agencies for a further **76** allegations; and
- recommended internal investigation for **2** allegations.

Suspected Serious Misconduct (SSM)



Action taken (SSM allegations)








ALLEGATIONS ASSESSED

Of the **446** allegations assessed as involving suspected serious misconduct, just under half involved WA Police.



ALLEGATION OUTCOMES


During the quarter, the outcomes of **206** allegations were recorded. **119** of these outcomes were sustained with **84** relating to WA Police.



IMPROVEMENT / DISCIPLINARY ACTION



Of the **35** allegations that were **sustained** this quarter, the two most common courses of action were local area improvement action (e.g. training, guidance, counselling) and dismissal.

Of the **84** allegations **sustained** this quarter, the most common course of action was local area improvement action.



Dismissals

Thirteen public officers in total were recorded as being dismissed in the quarter because of serious misconduct.
