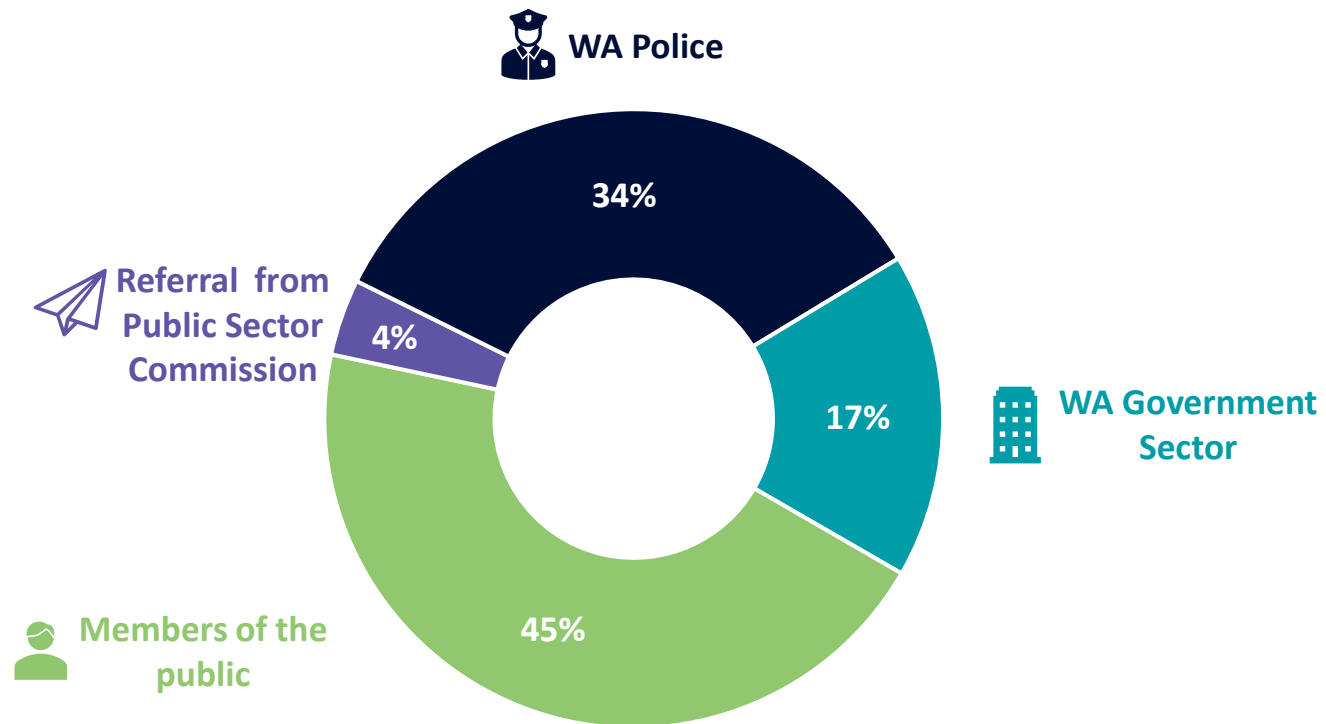

Reports and Notifications - Source

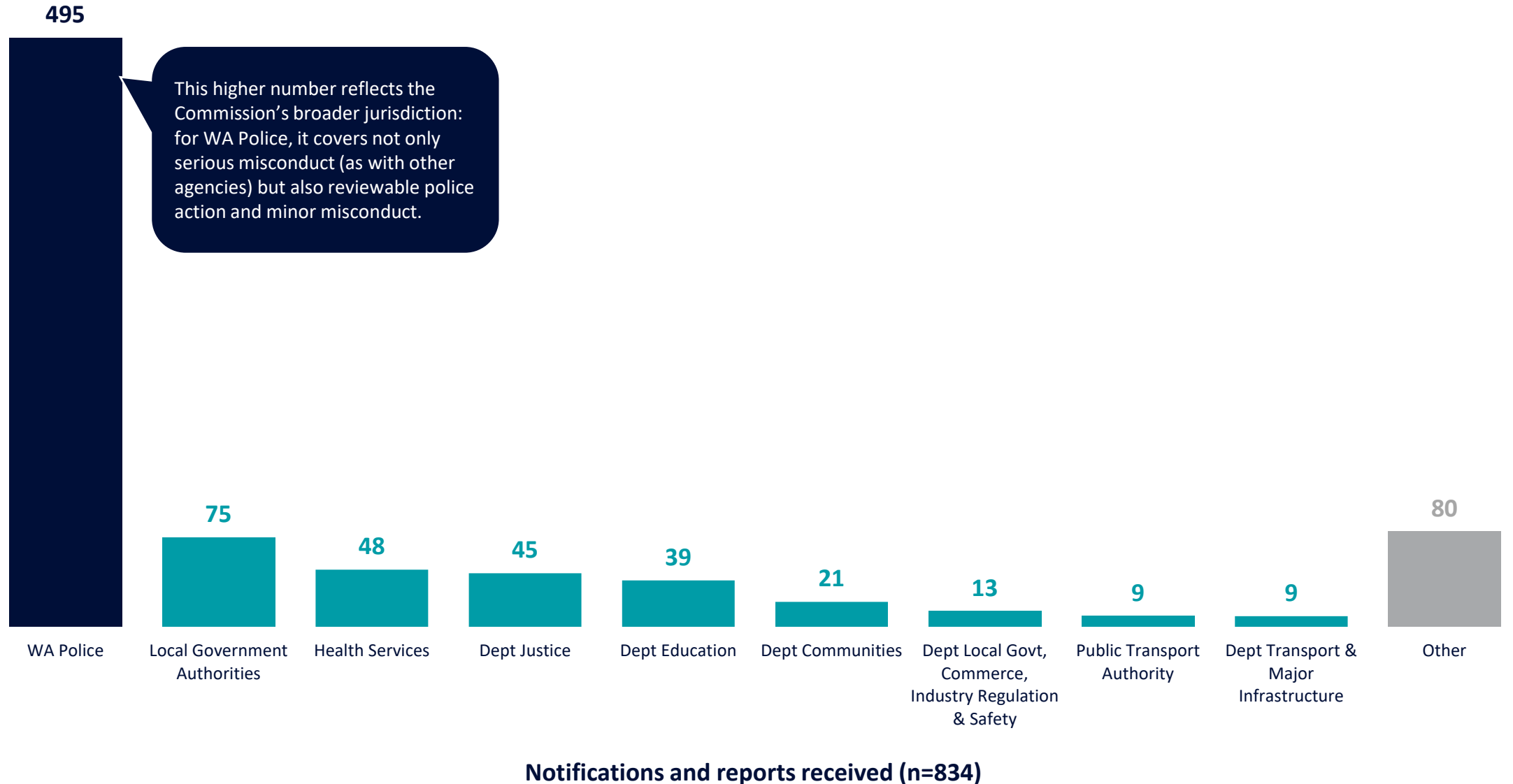
The Commission received 834 reports and notifications of alleged serious misconduct and police misconduct during the quarter. Close to a half of these were received from members of the public.

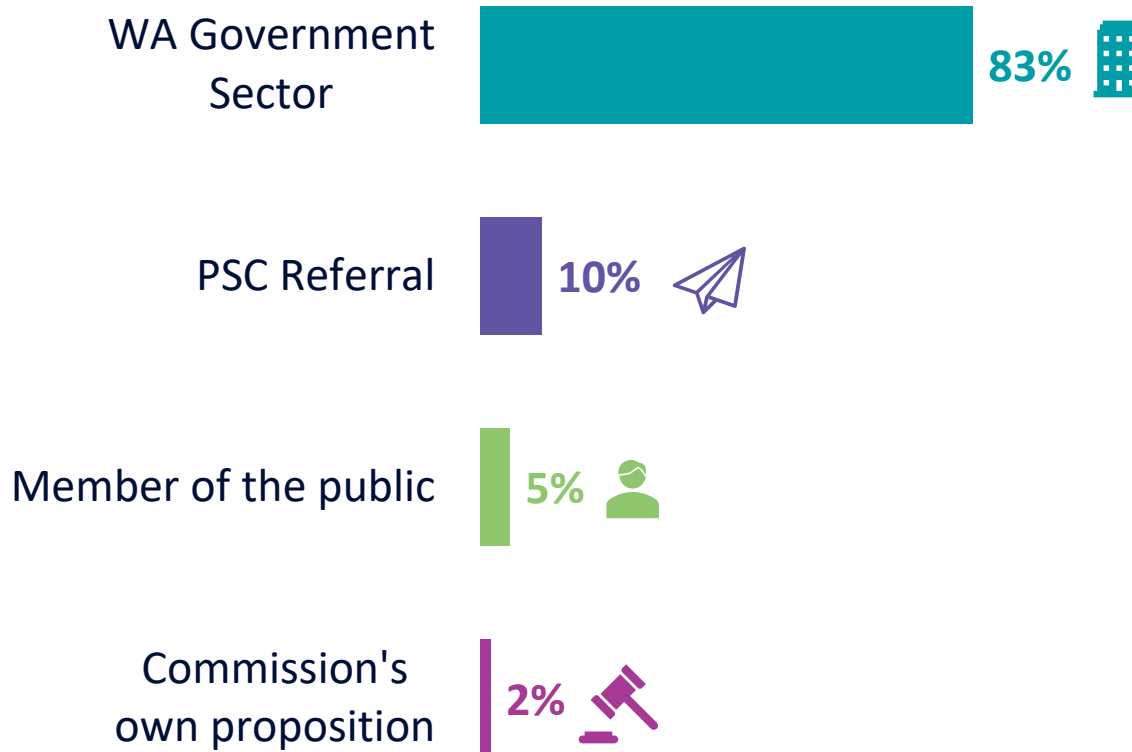

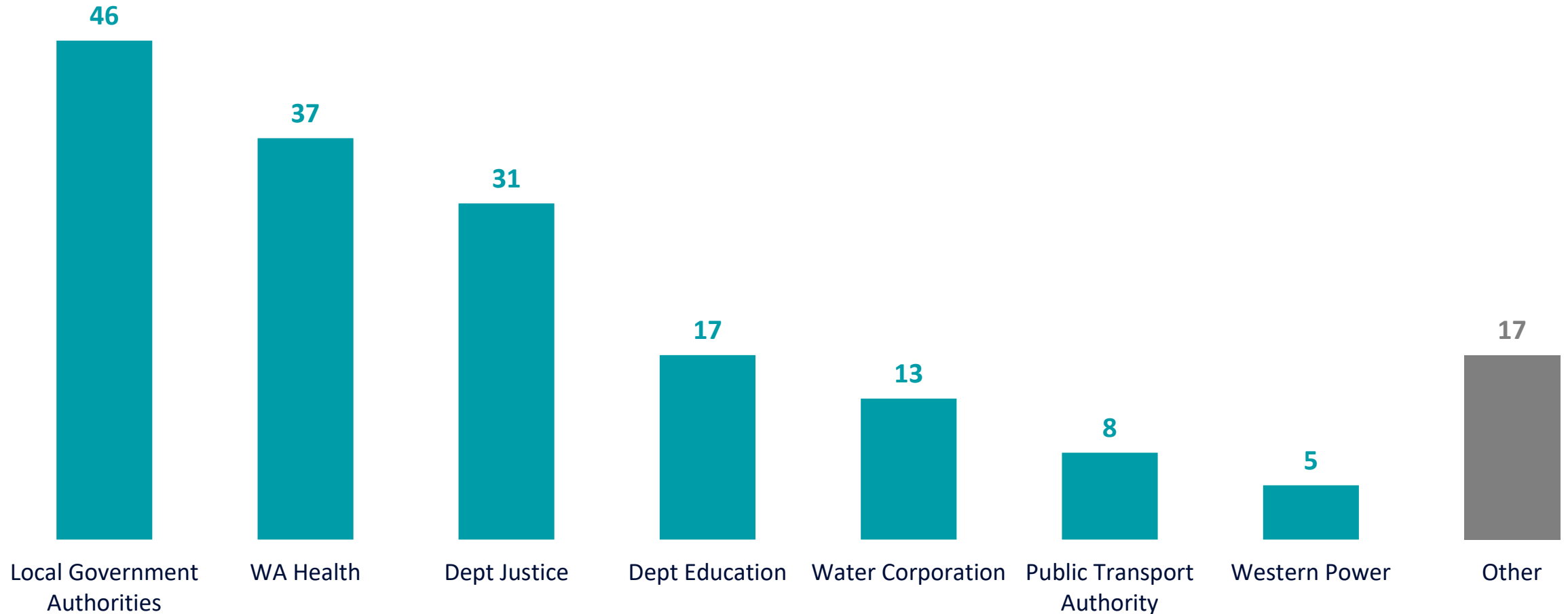

 Source of suspected serious misconduct allegations





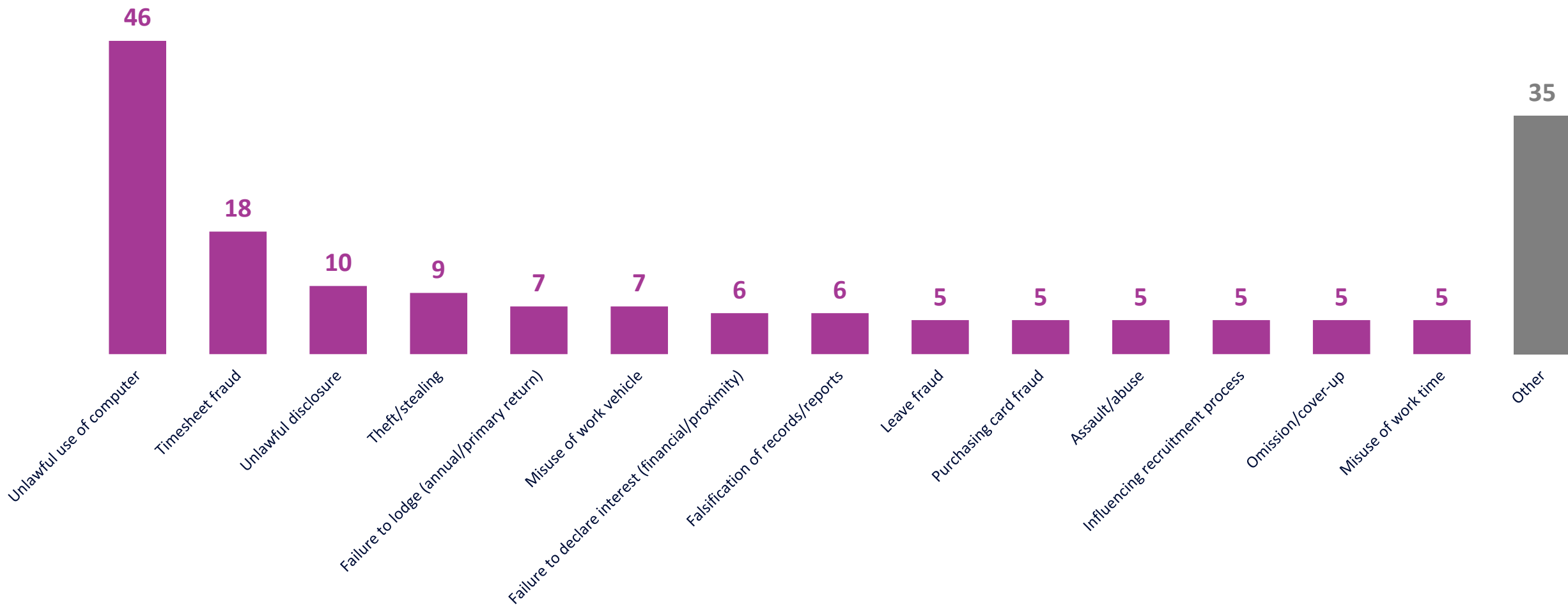
Suspected serious misconduct allegations by subject officer agency

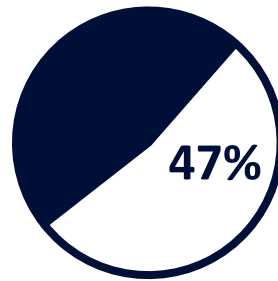

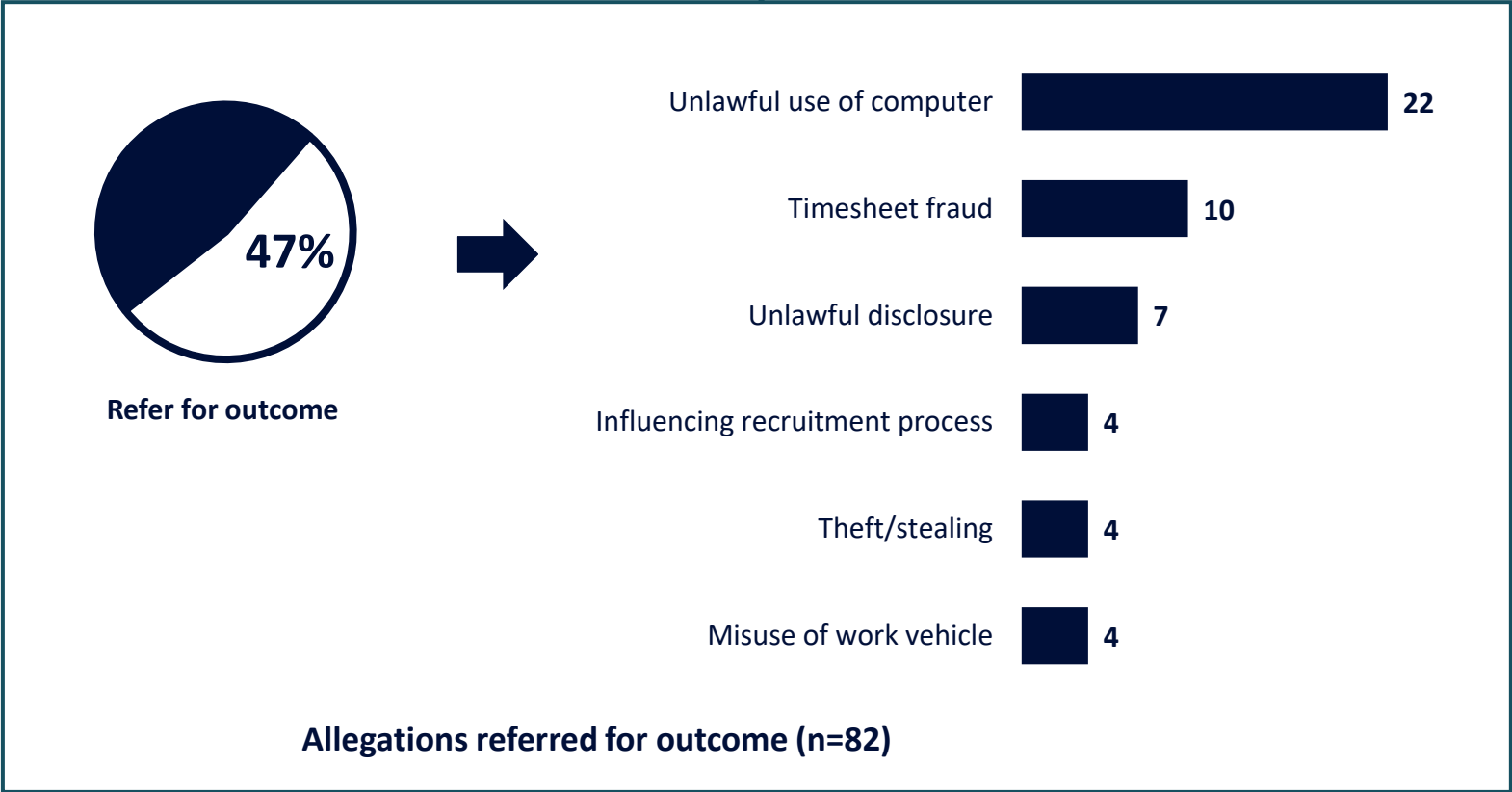

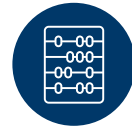

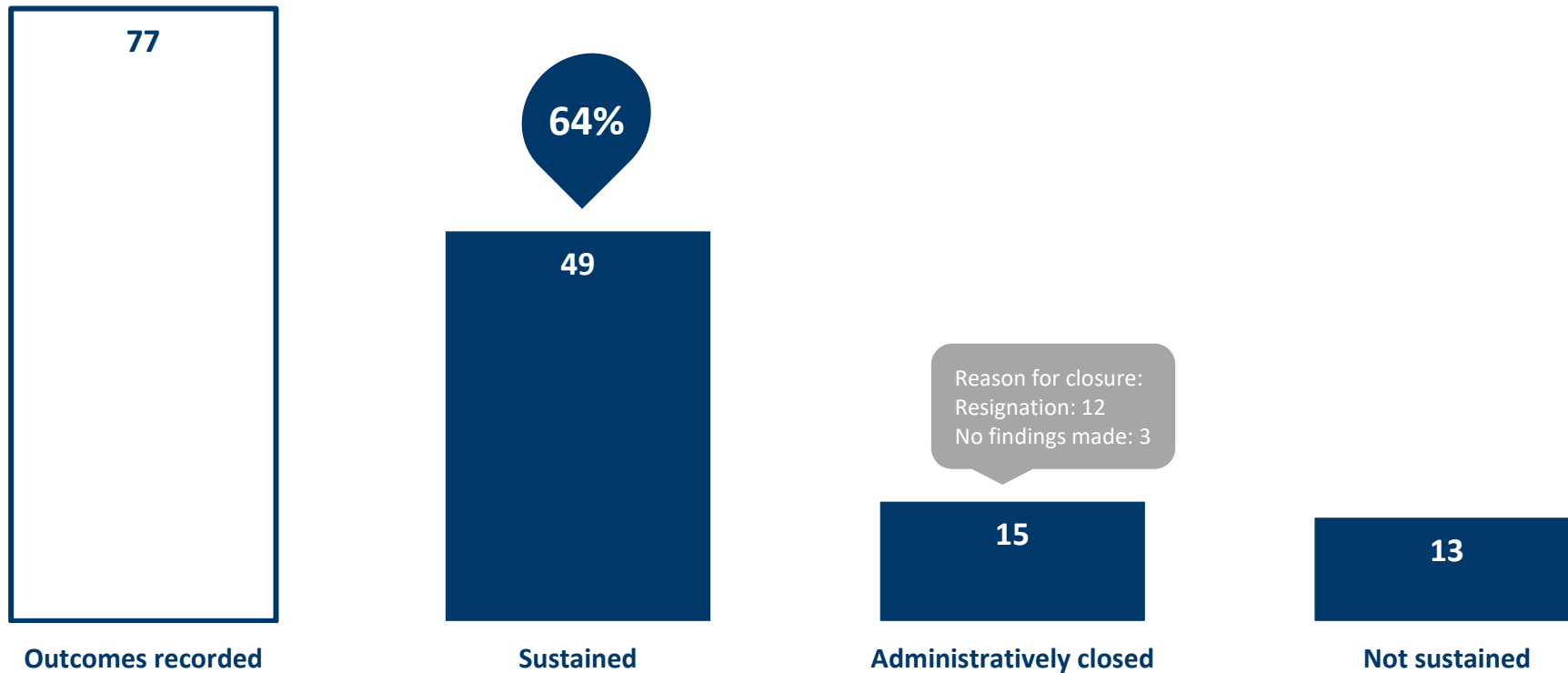

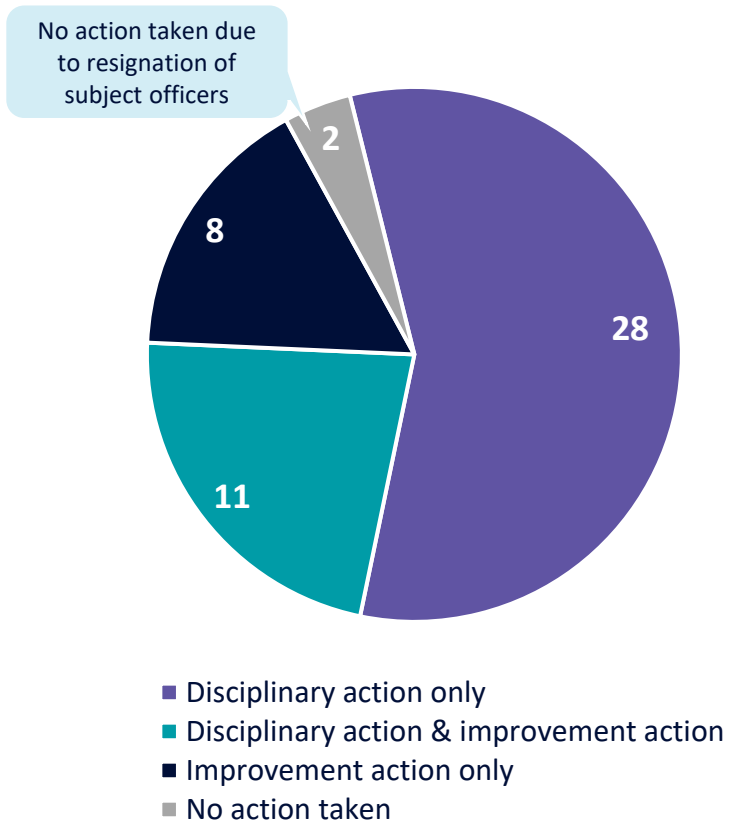
Outcomes recorded

The Commission recorded agency investigation outcomes for 77 allegations of serious misconduct during the quarter. Of these, just under two-thirds (64%) were sustained.





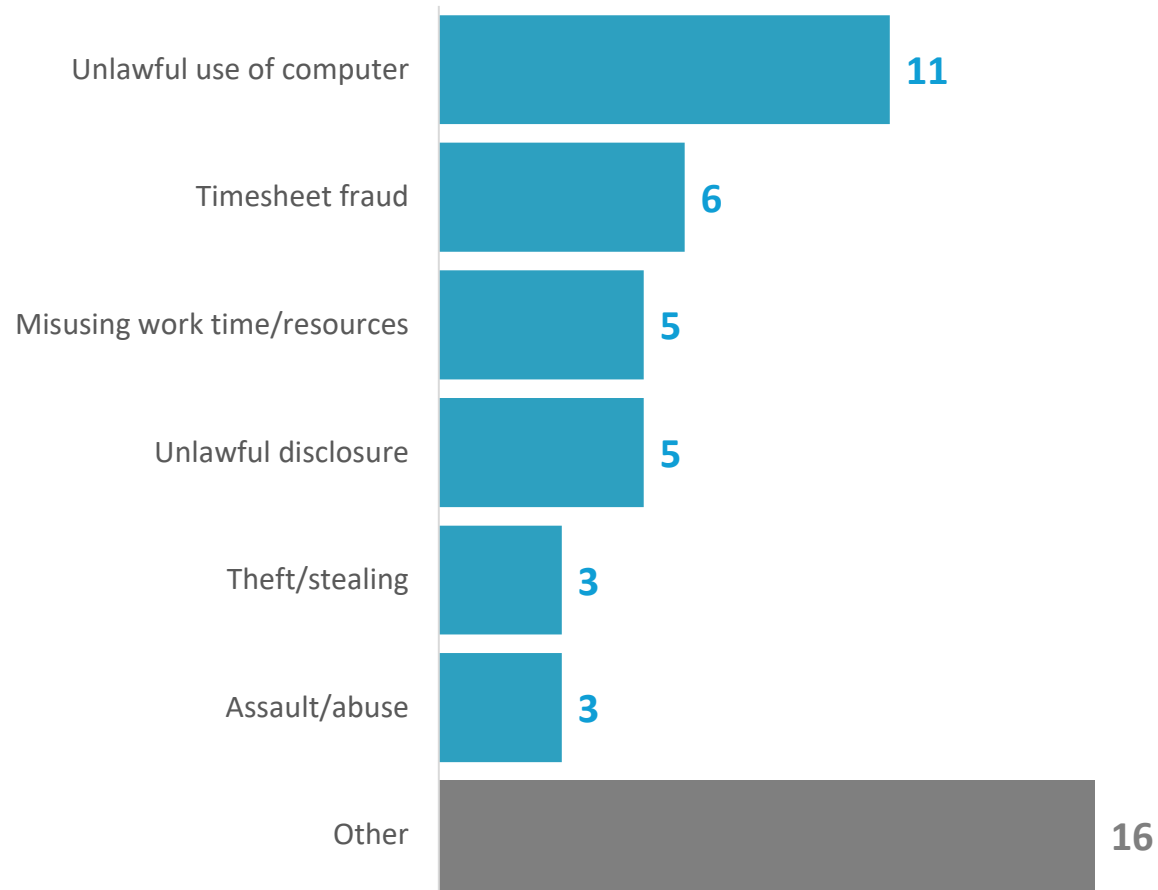

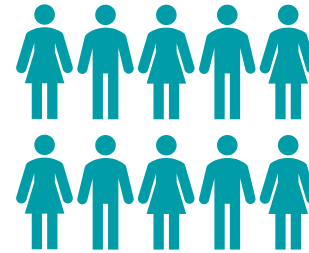

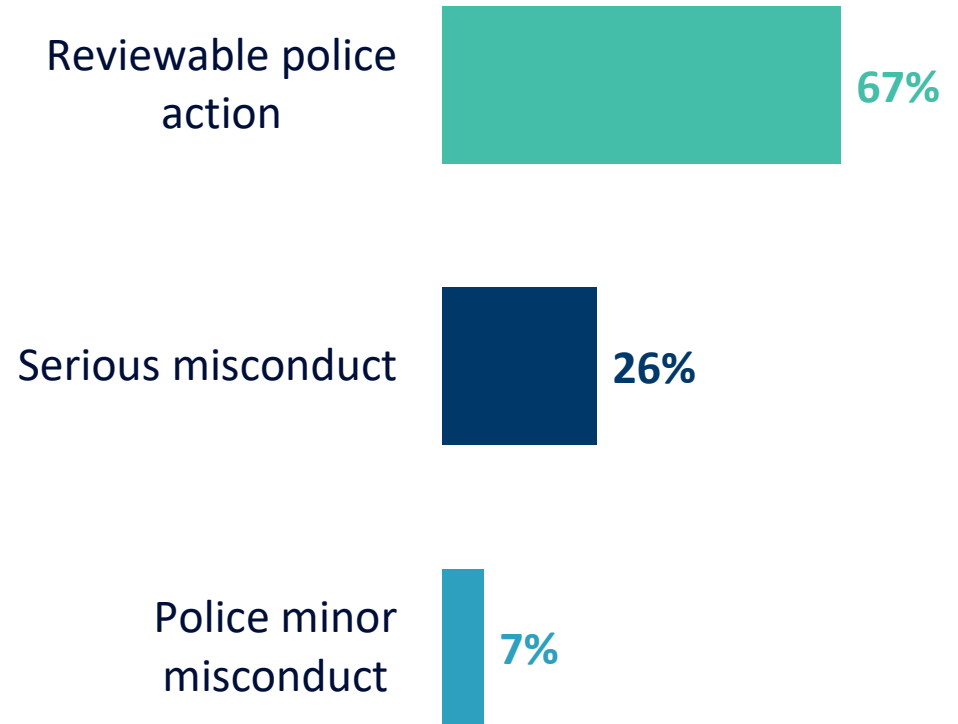

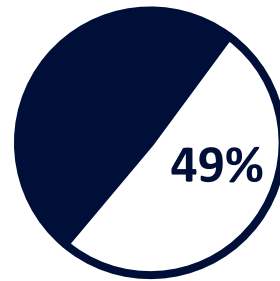

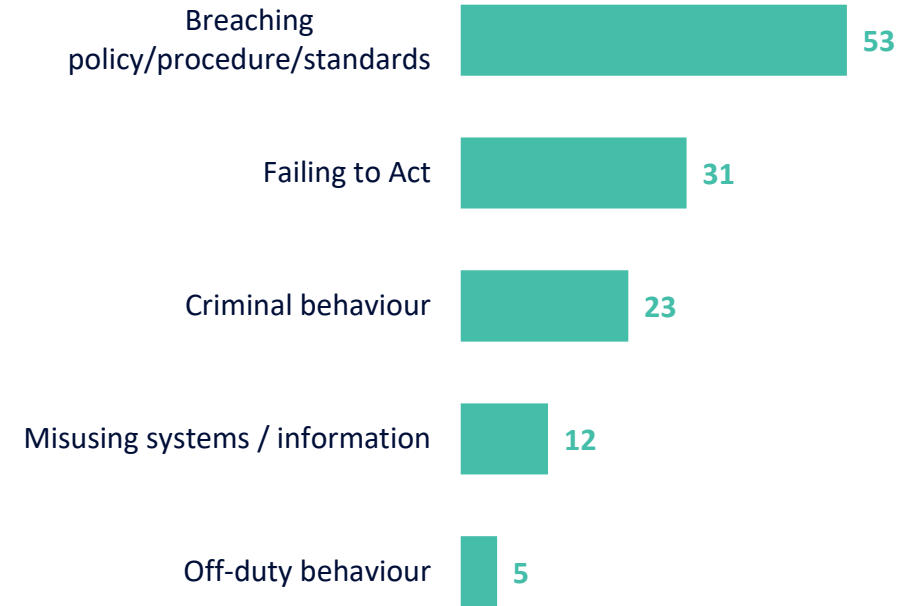

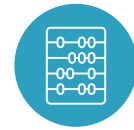
Categories of allegations referred for outcome (n=129)

Outcomes recorded

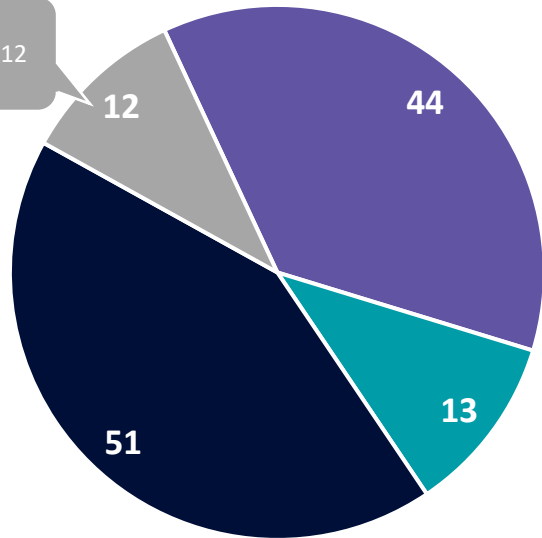
The Commission recorded the outcomes of 176 allegations of serious misconduct during the quarter. Of these, just over two-thirds (68%) were sustained.

Subject officer resigned for 11 of 12 allegations

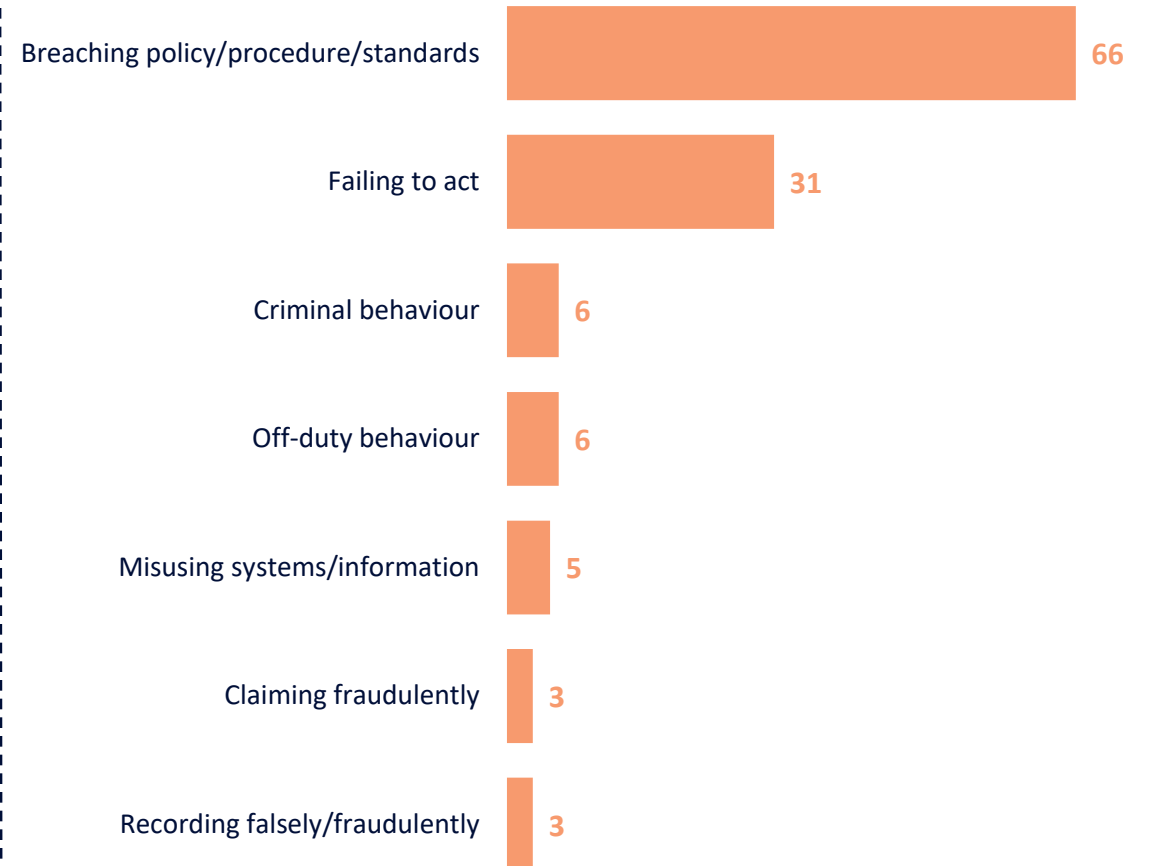

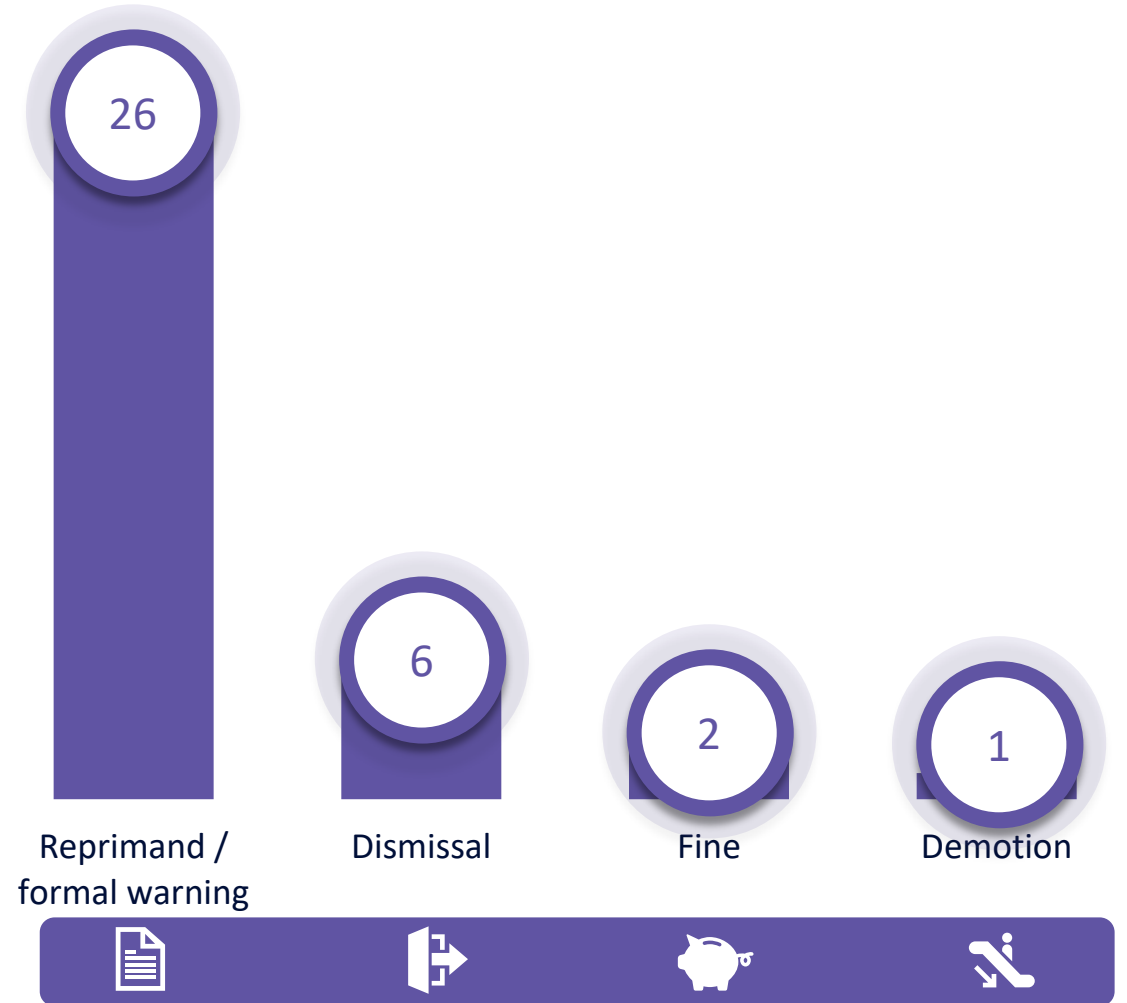

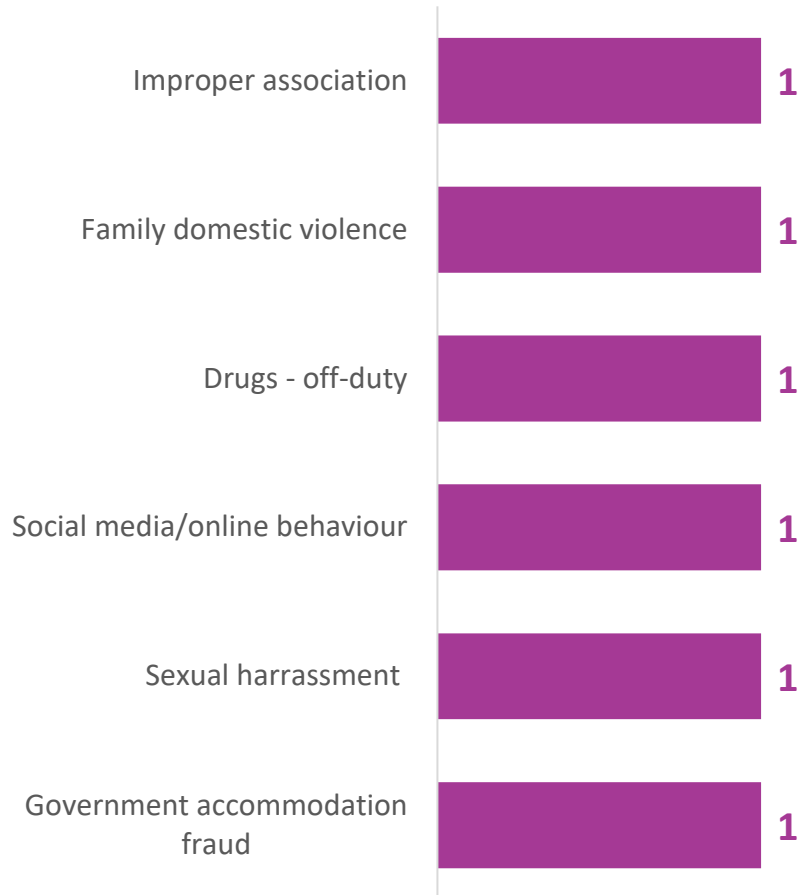

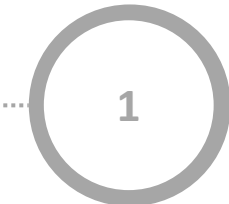
