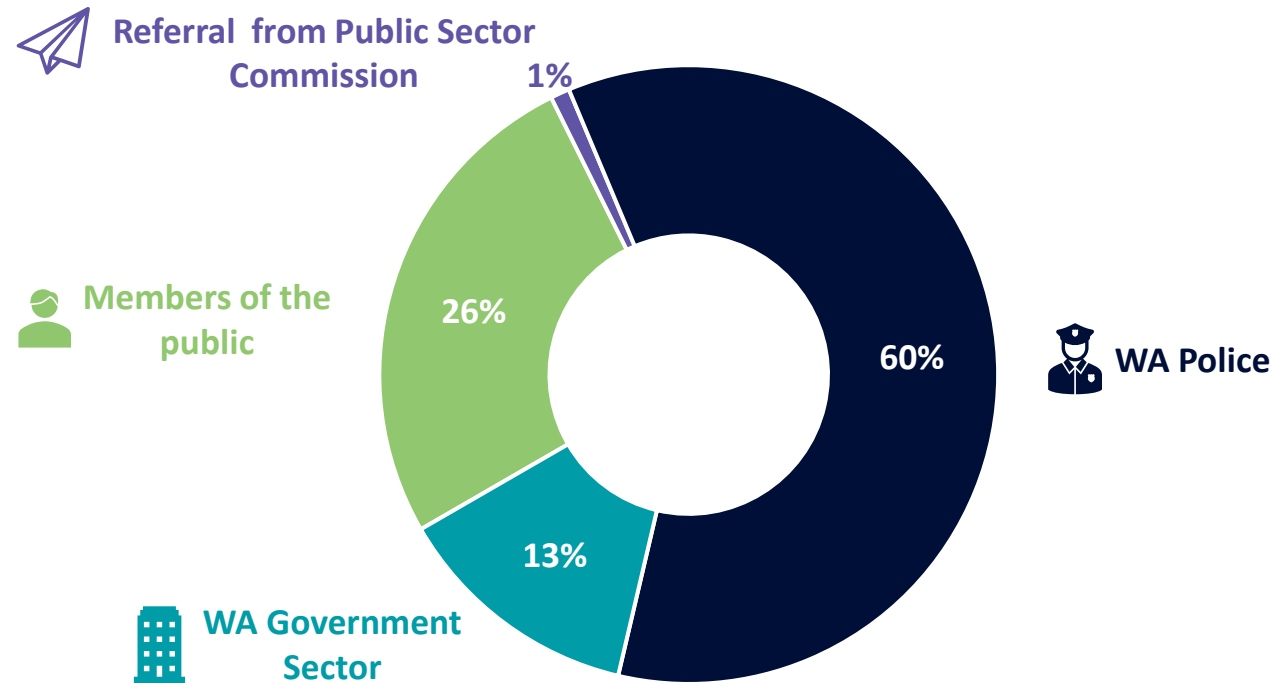

Reports and Notifications - Source

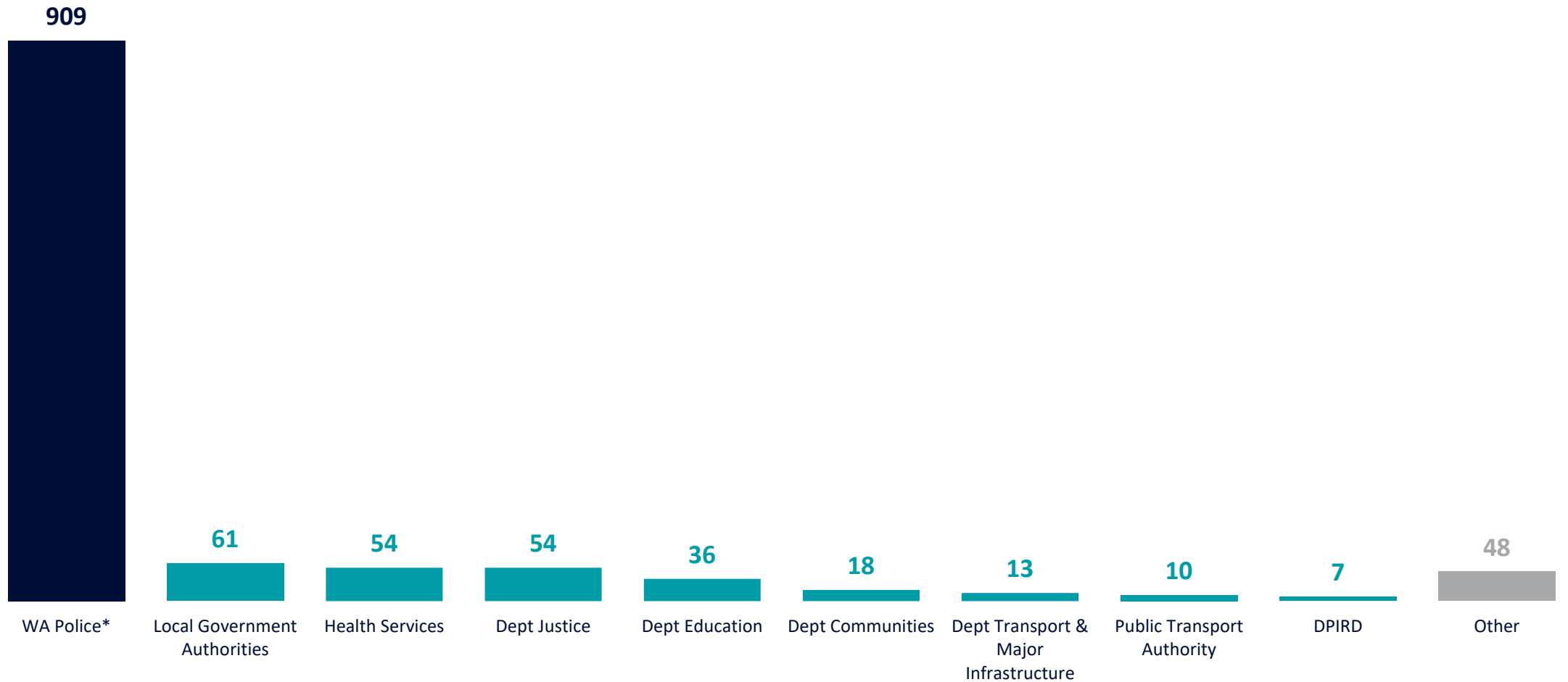
The Commission received 1,210 reports and notifications of alleged serious misconduct and police misconduct during the quarter.

Notifications and reports received (n=1,210)

* This higher number reflects the Commission's broader jurisdiction: for WA Police, it covers not only serious misconduct (as with other agencies) but also reviewable police action and minor misconduct. Further, this quarter includes a consolidated notification of previously unreported matters, which has temporarily increased the total.

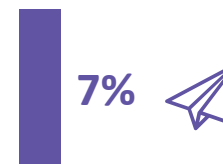

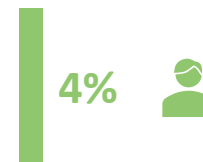

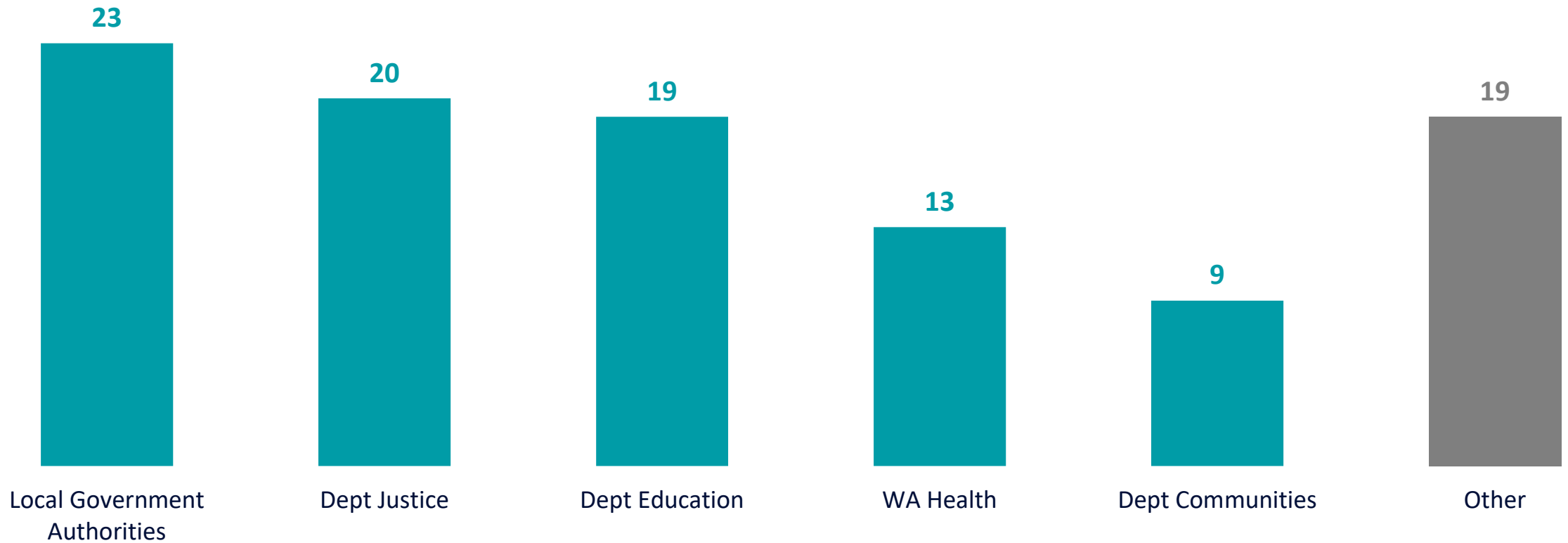

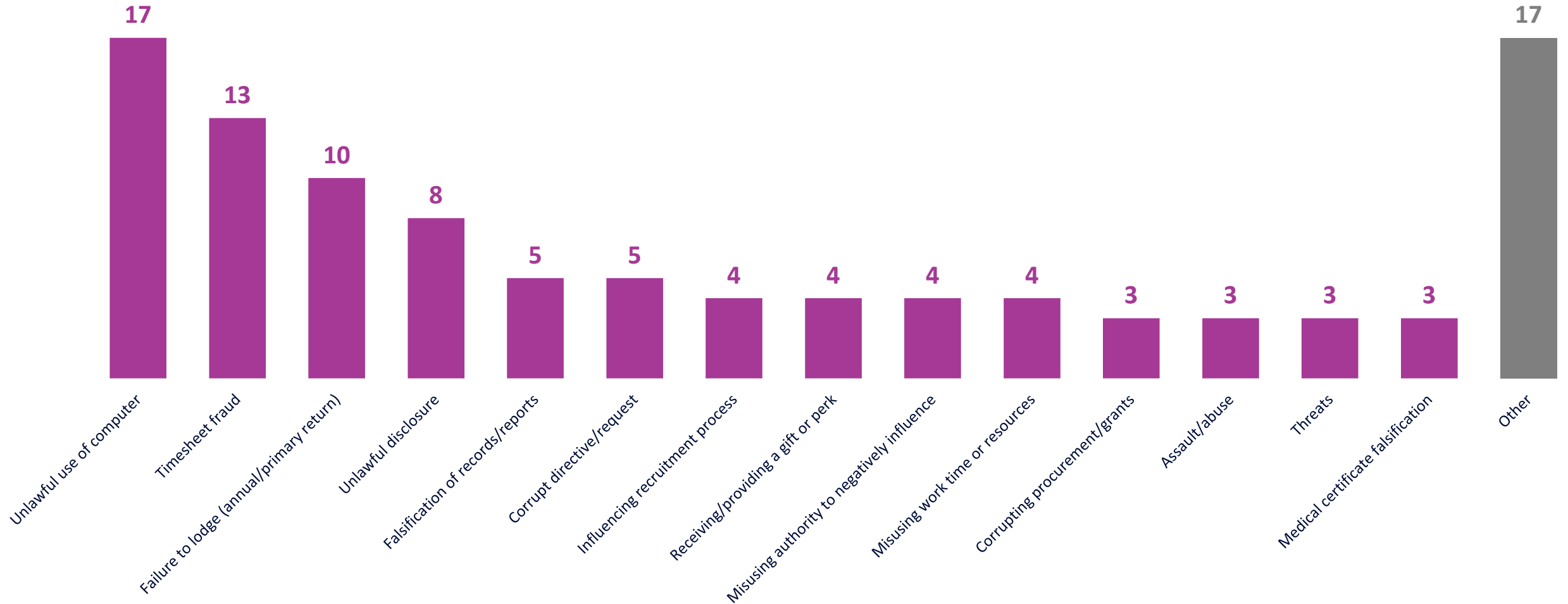
Suspected serious misconduct allegations by subject officer agency

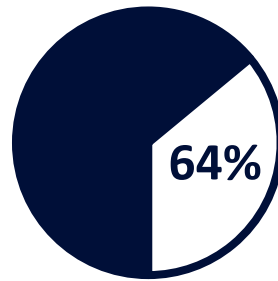

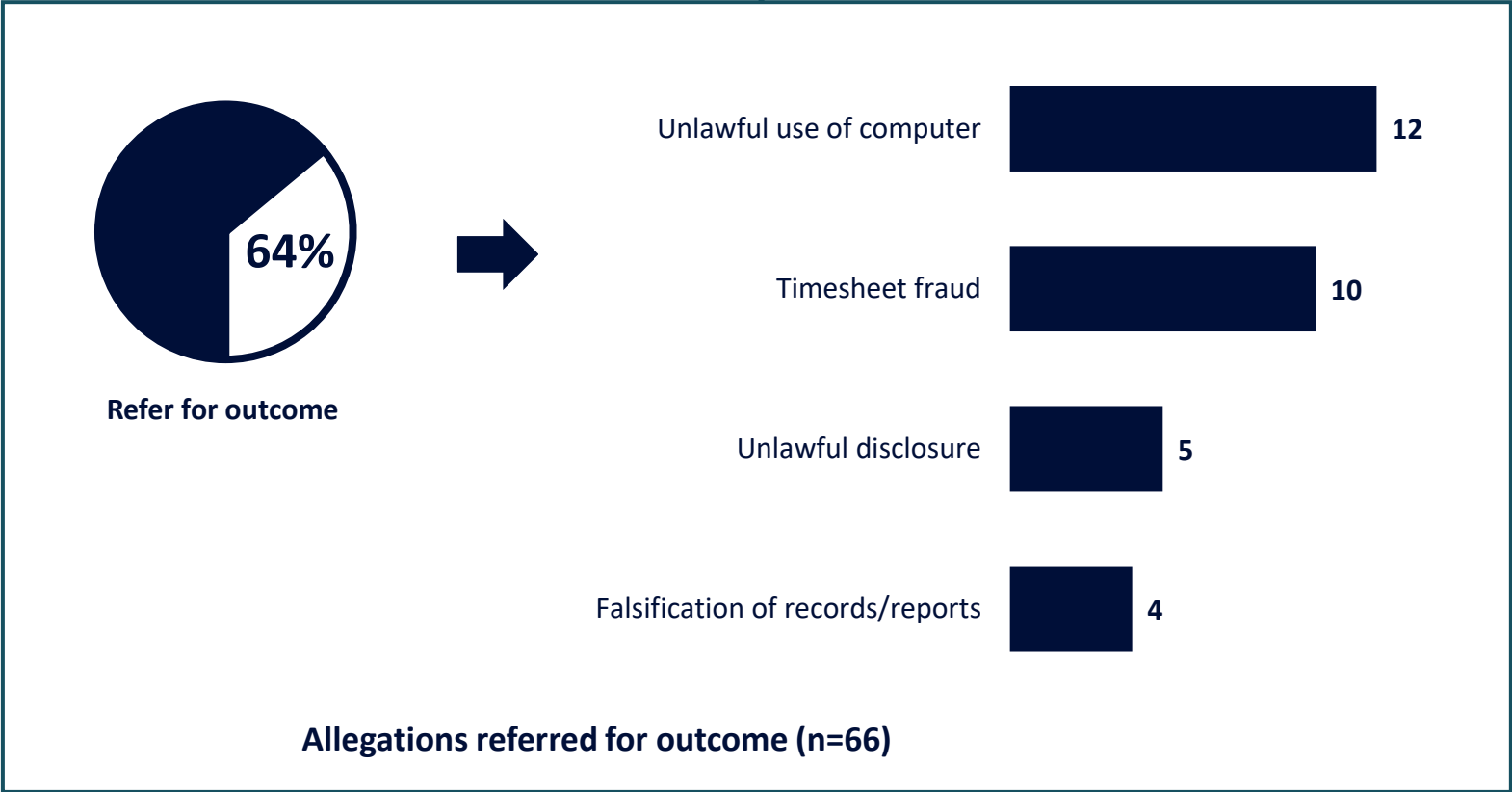

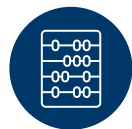

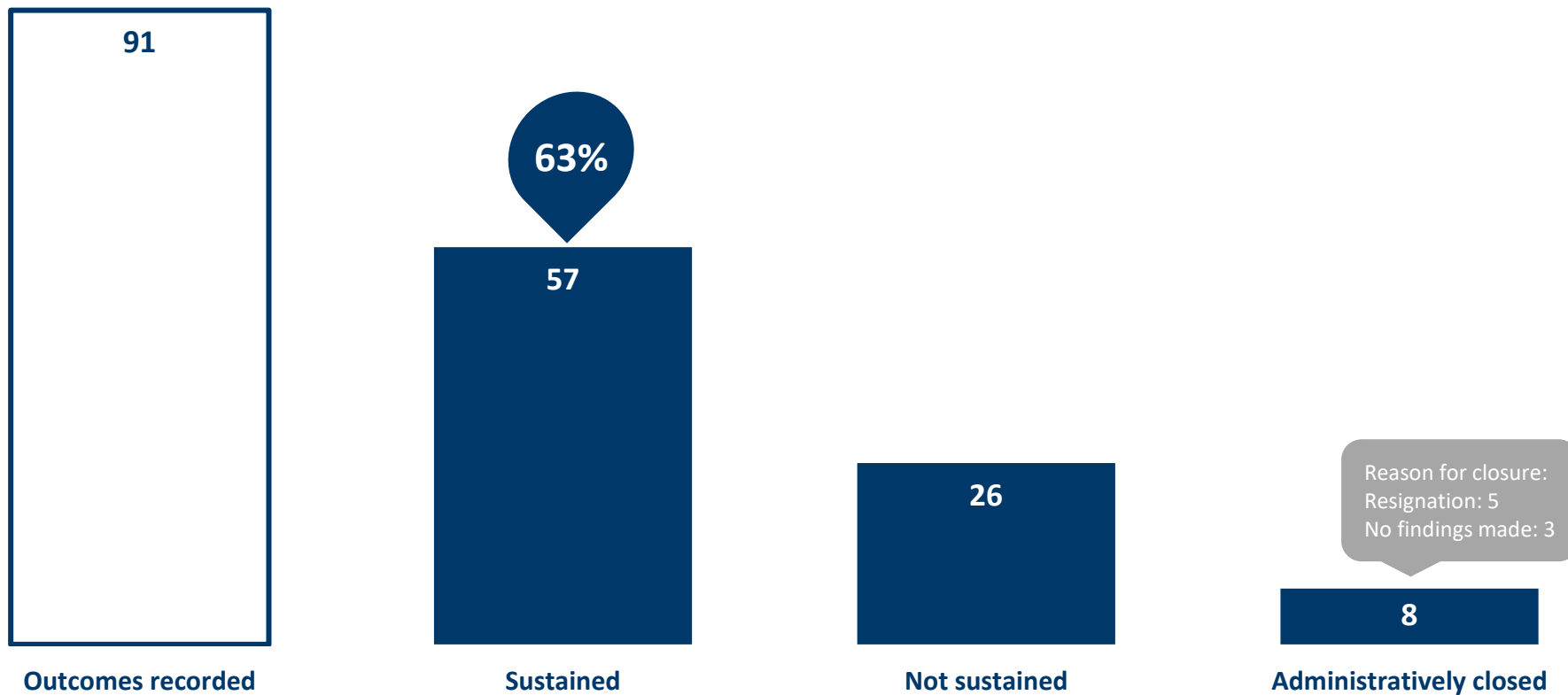

Outcomes recorded

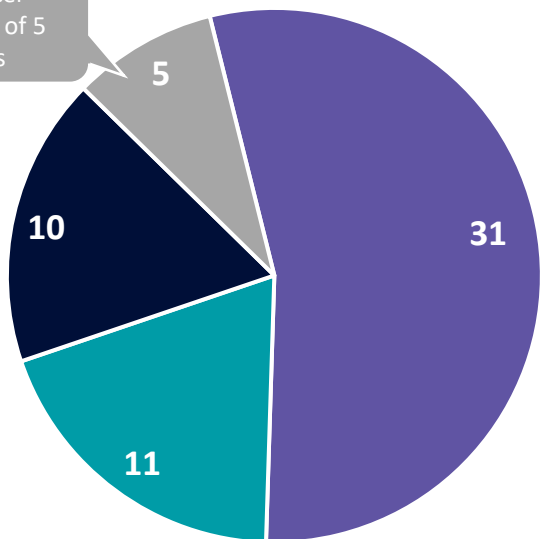
The Commission recorded agency investigation outcomes for 91 allegations of serious misconduct during the quarter. Of these, just under two-thirds (63%) were sustained.

Subject officer resigned for 4 of 5 allegations

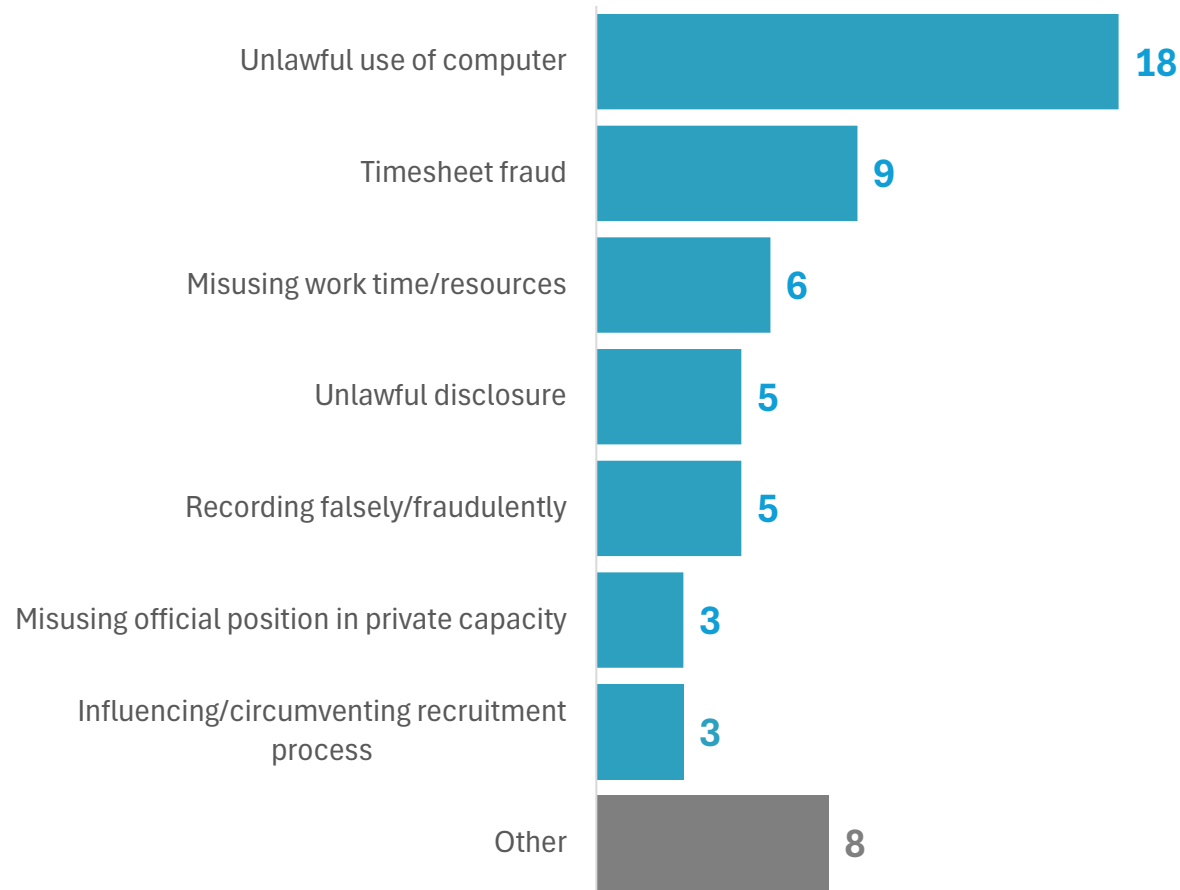

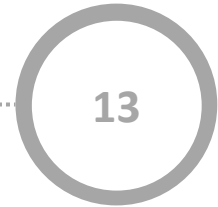

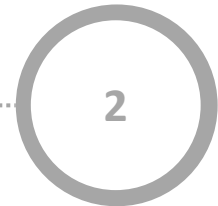

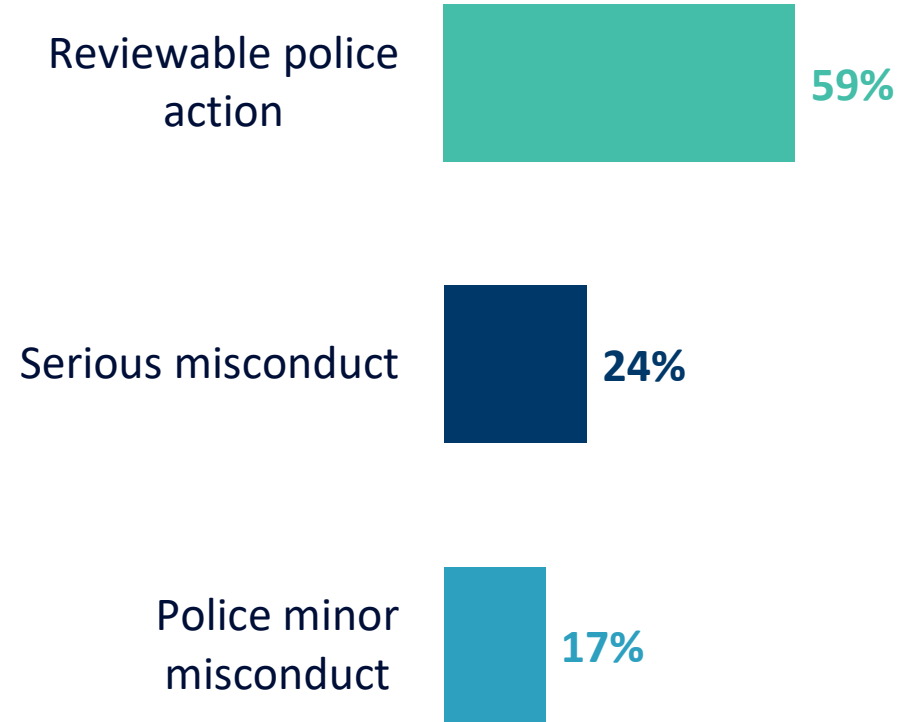

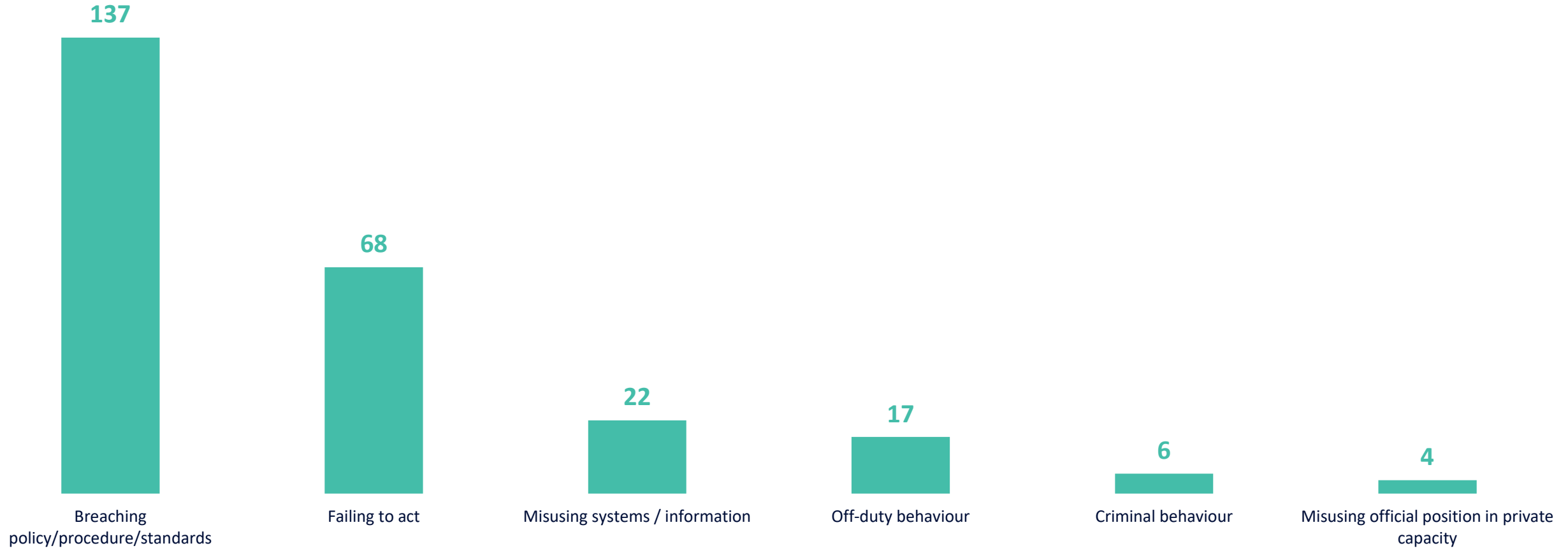

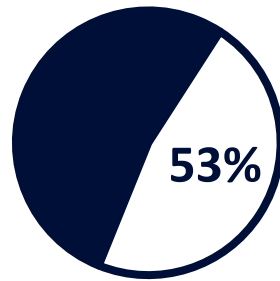

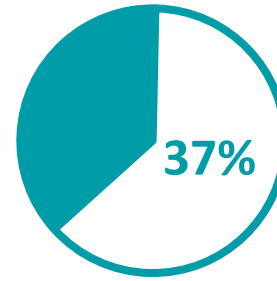

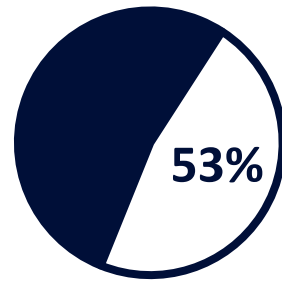

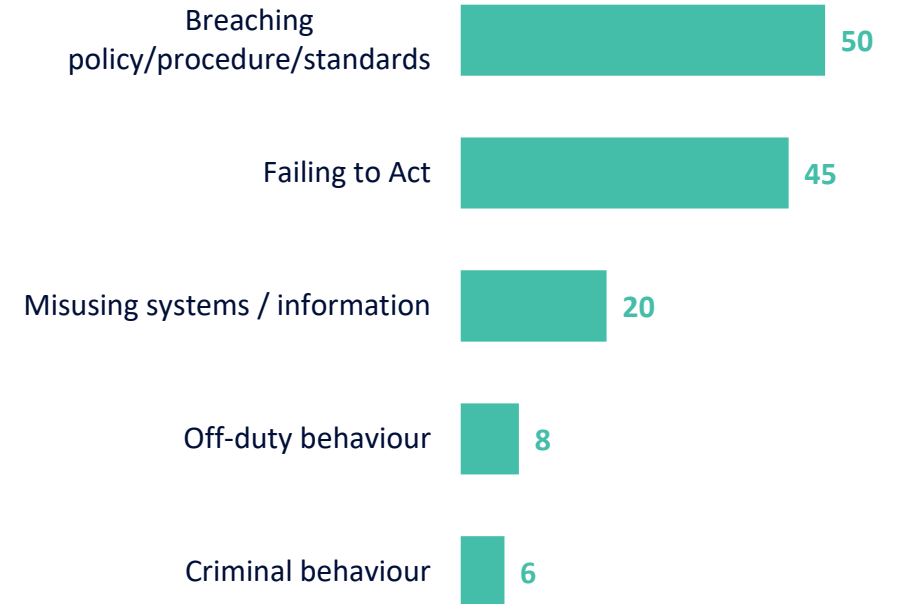

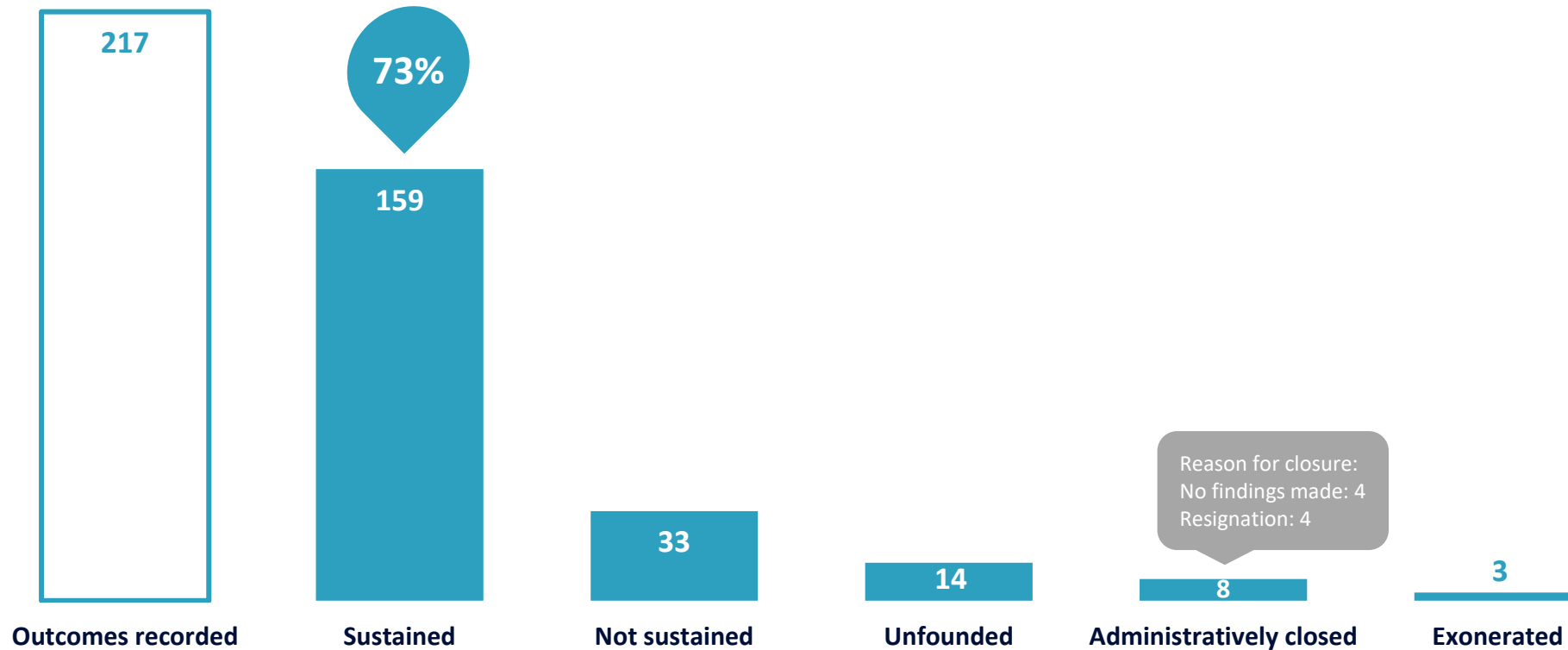

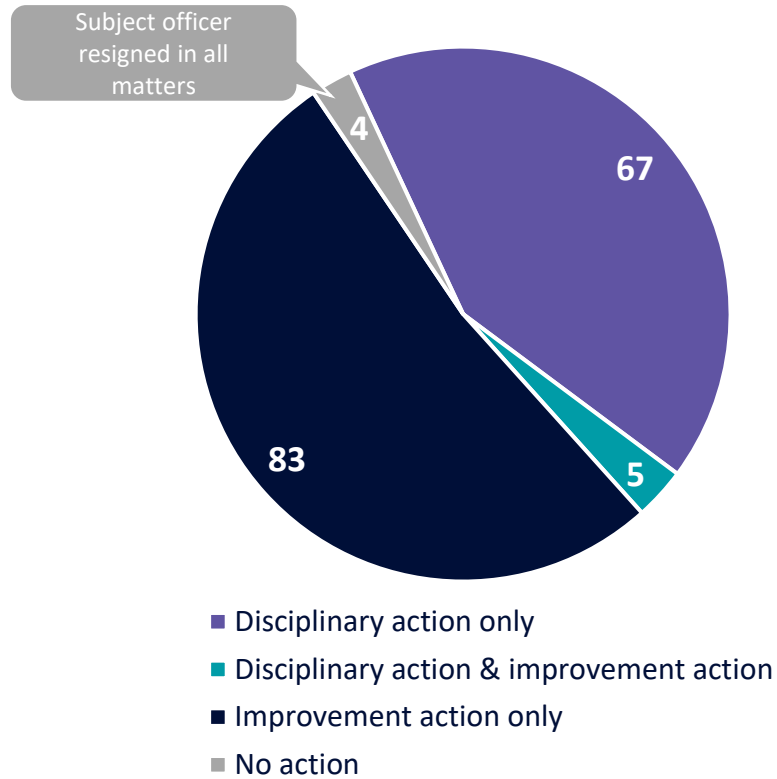
Outcomes recorded

The Commission recorded the outcomes of 217 allegations of serious misconduct during the quarter. Of these, almost three-quarters were sustained.





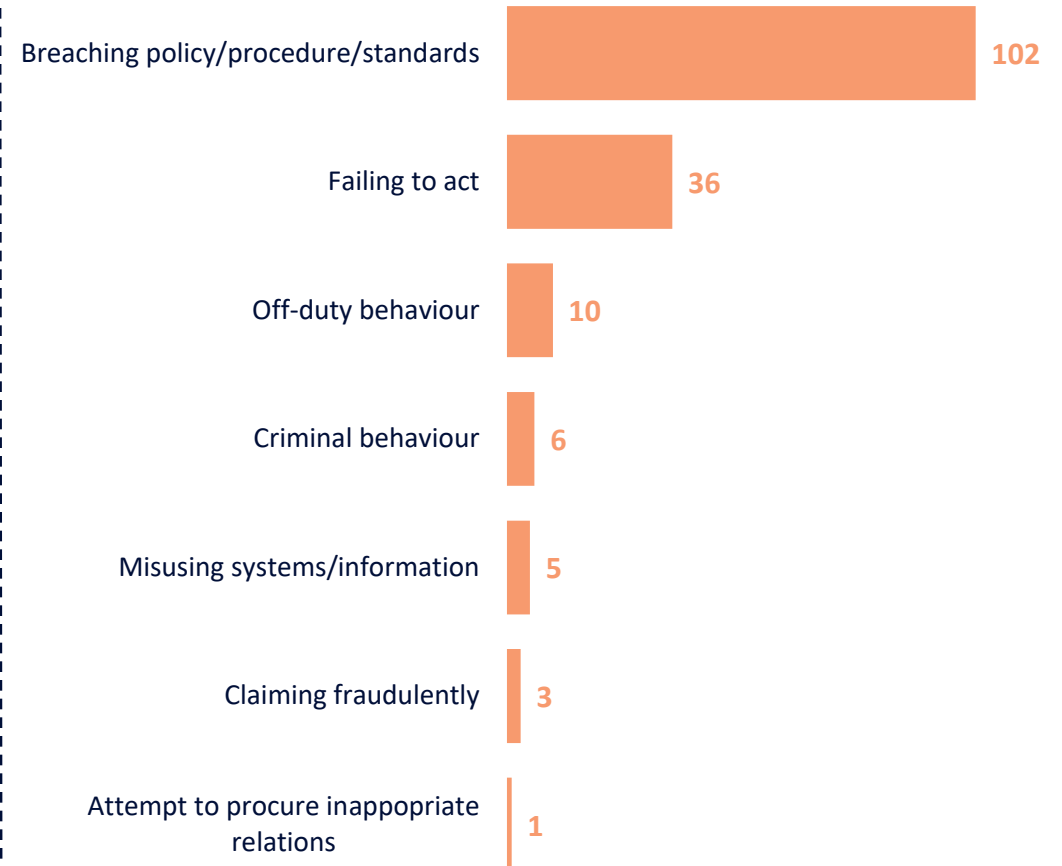
Response to sustained allegations (by count)



Sustained allegations (n=159)

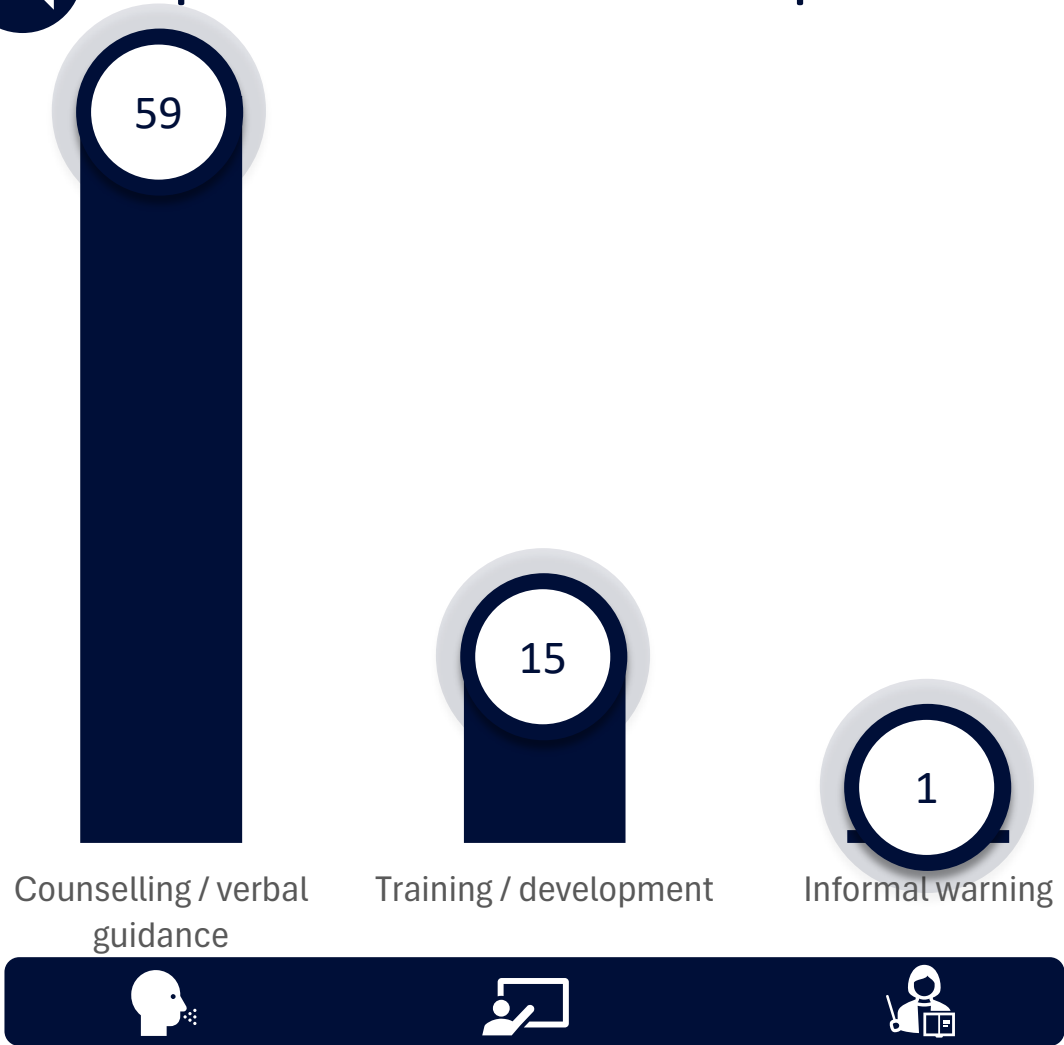

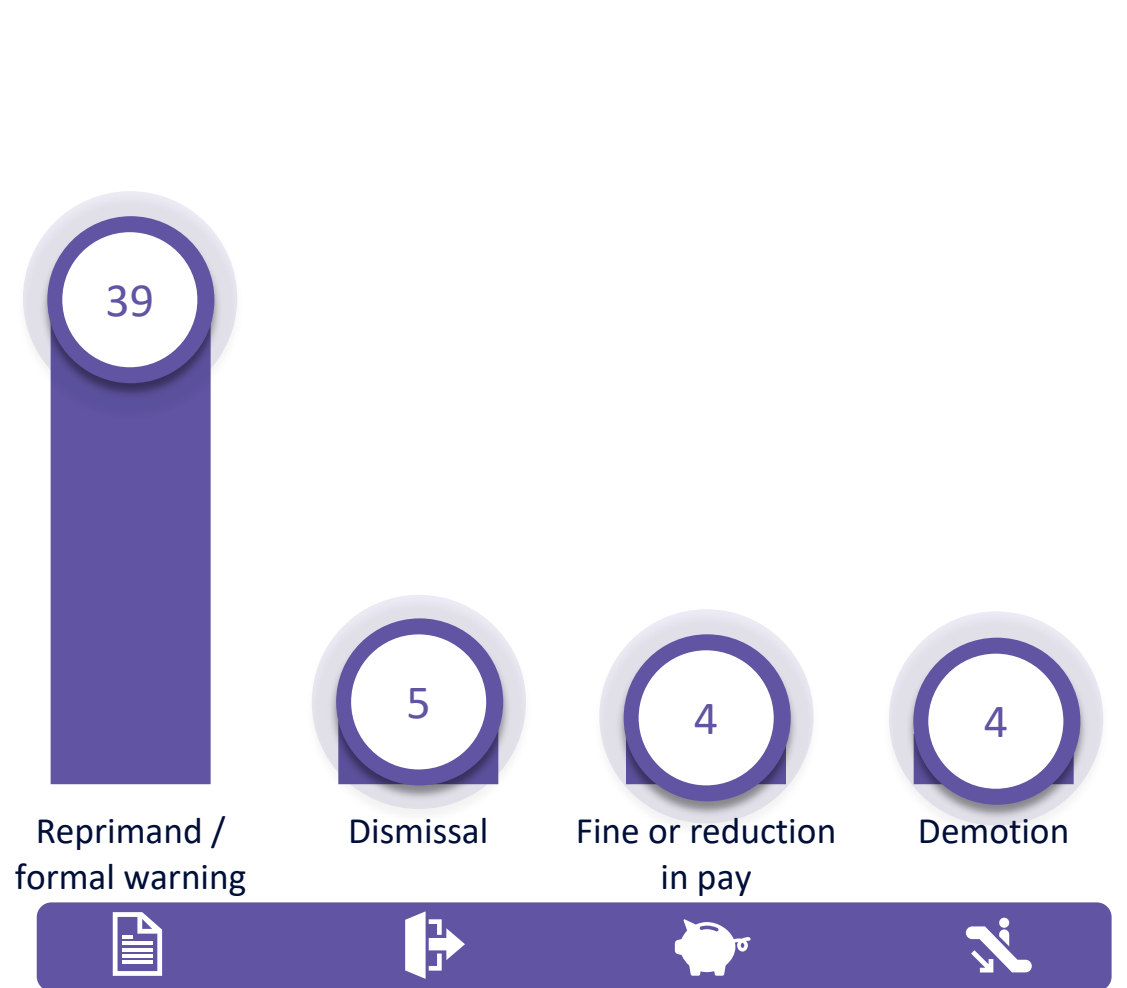

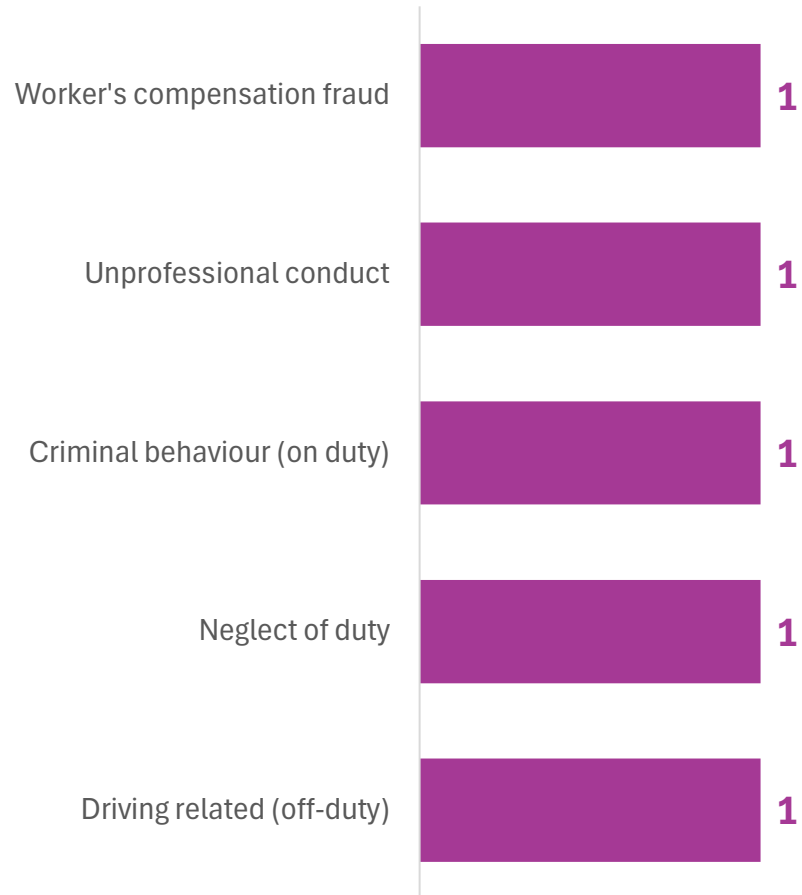

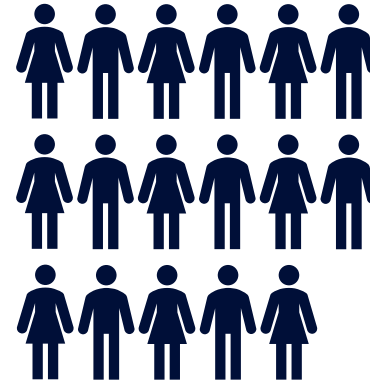
